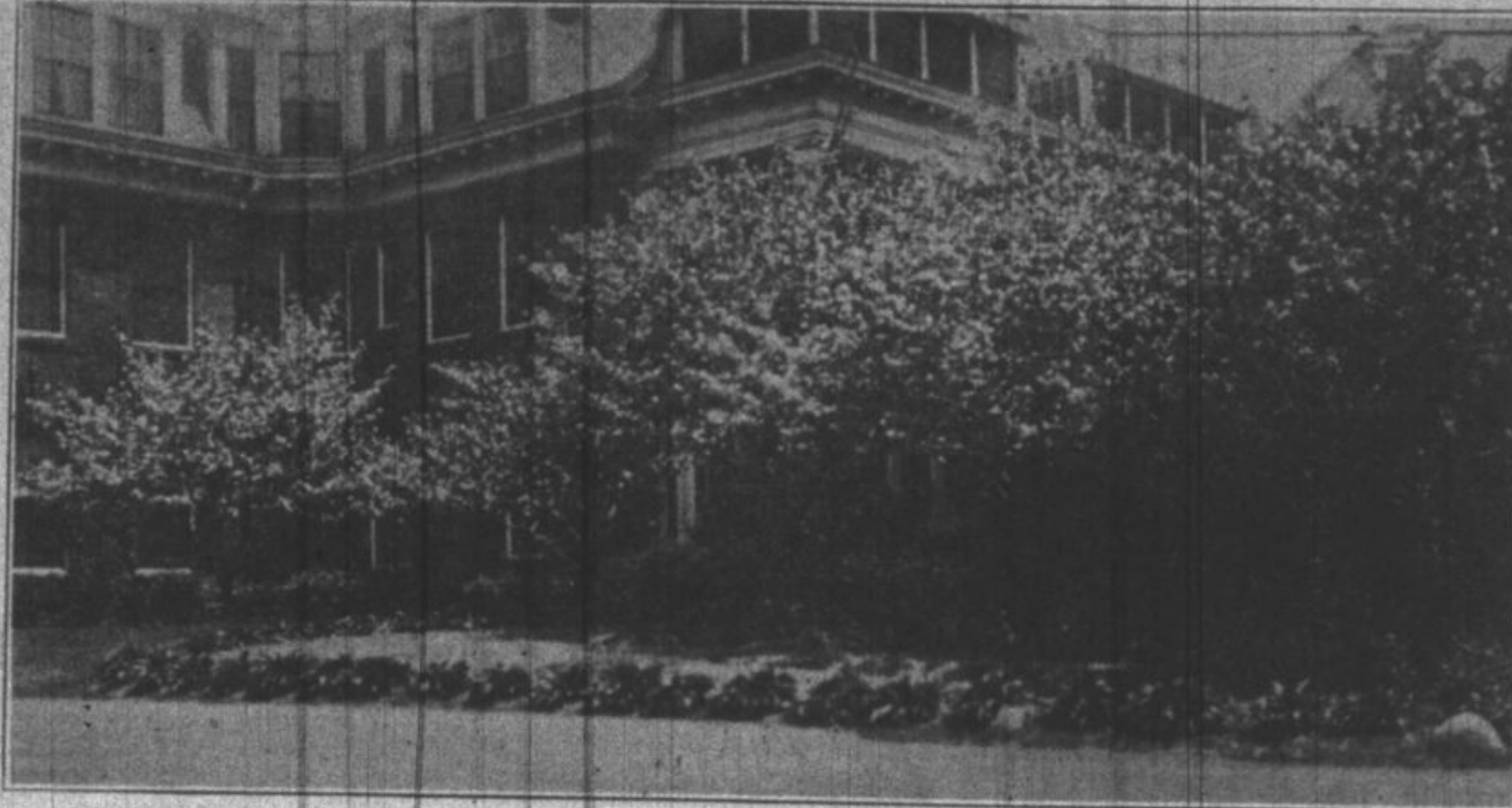
Highland Park Y.M.C. Defeats Boosters 5-4

Bill Provides for Cut In Fishing License Commissions

Fees received under present laws by city, county and village clerks, for issuing fishing, hunting and trapping licenses average 23 percent of the annual receipts of the Department of Conservation, Chas. F. Thompson, director, said in urging sportsmen and their organizations to enlist the support of legislators for bills now in the General Assembly to eliminate commissions.

Instead of flat fees now paid the clerks, pending legislation would limit their cut to five per cent of the gross receipts, thereby increasing the department's revenue without additional cost to sportsmen.

GREAT LAKES TO BE REOPENED JULY 29

Culmination of the agitation begun by the American Legion and other patriotic and civic organizations is the announcement that the Great Lakes Naval Training Station will reopen July 29.

Further cheering word is received from Congressman Ralph E. Church to the effect that another \$400,000 would be allotted to the naval station from public works funds, bringing the total to more than \$800,000.

open with colorful military formalities, it was definitely announced by the new commandant, Rear Admiral John Downes.

The station's 950-bed hospital is to be maintained at full efficiency under Captain Henry L. Dollard, of the naval bureau of medicine and surgery, the admiral announced. It has been stated that the hospital will require almost entire rehabilitation and equipment.

The rest of 40 officers are expected to arrive on July 1 to prepare the station for receiving recruits. At this time work will be begun to place physical equipment in order.

Also, during July, it reliably reported that 230 enlisted navy men and 60 marines will arrive to make the permanent personnel.

RAILROAD SOLDIERS WIN RECOGNITION

Representing the American soldiers who took over the collapsing railroad systems of Europe, and through the introduction of American equipment and operating methods kept troop and supply trains moving on schedule in the most critical period of the World War, a delegation from the famous 31st Regiment of Railway Engineers won the distinction of first place in arranging reunion plans during the American Legion's national convention at St. Louis next September 23 to 26, inclusive.

Although men of the 31st Regiment — most of them professional railroad men — ran trains from Russia to Italy and all systems in between, in a manner winning official commendation from the Allied governments, the regiment's reputation with the American Expeditionary Force was not established until two weeks after the Armistice. And a single crew won that distinction. Taking a train laden with French liquors on Thanksgiving eve from La Rochelle to La Pollice, a distance of six miles, the crew arrived at their destination empty, prompting a suit for \$90,000 by the French Government against the United States.

Royal Baking Powder Biscuits 2 cups Town Crier Flour 1/2 teaspoon Royal Baking Powder 1/2 cup milk or half milk and half water Mix together flour, baking powder and salt. Add shortening and beat in lightly with steel fork; add liquid slowly to make soft dough. Roll or pat with hands on floured board to about 1/4-inch thickness. Cut with slightly greased pan and bake in hot oven at 475° Fahrenheit about 12 minutes. If a shorter biscuit is preferred, use 4 tablespoons shortening. 1-lb. can 39c
