

### Deerfield Centennial Invitations Ready

The commemoration of Deerfield's Centennial will be a three-day affair on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, June 28, 29, and 30. The main event is the historical pageant which will be presented on Saturday, June 29 at 7 p.m. on the local high school athletic field in the open air.

#### Deerfield Celebration

"Dear Friend:  
Friday, June 28 and Saturday, June 29, Deerfield, Ill., is celebrating its 100th birthday.

The Centennial committees are making great plans for this two-day (non-profit) celebration.

Friday, June 28 has been set aside as Homecoming Day. Old settlers will hold family reunions to renew old acquaintances and revive old friendships. Basket lunches will be served by the various families and promptly at 7:30 p.m. all are requested to gather for a free band concert.

Saturday, June 29 will be the big day. The program will be as follows:

1 p.m.—Parade, with band, drum and bugle corps; floats of business houses; organizations, etc.

3 p.m.—Baseball game between two evenly matched ball clubs.

5-6:30 p.m.—Supper hour. Supper may be purchased from any of the four churches who will serve complete meals on the grounds.

7 p.m.—Pageant depicting the history of Deerfield.

Sunday has been set aside in the various churches of Deerfield to hold special services; and at 4 p.m., Sunday afternoon, a special vesper service will be held in Jewett Park under the auspices of the churches, with combined choirs, and special speakers for the occasion.

For a week previous to the cele-

bration there will be a historical exhibit. Three rooms will be completely furnished with furniture as used by some of the early pioneers. Old quilts, rugs, antiques, documents, pictures, etc., will be on display.

You are most cordially invited to attend any or all of these features of this Centennial celebration.
