**AN ORDINANCE**  
PROHIBITING THE SALE AT RETAIL OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR IN THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

Whereas, a petition was filed in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Highland Park containing the signatures of not less than twenty-five per cent (25%) of the voters of said City, and containing a request that the total number of votes cast for Governor in said City at the general election held on November 5, 1932, containing a request that the proposition:

"Shall the sale at retail of alcoholic liquor be prohibited in Highland Park?"

be submitted to the voters of said City at the next ensuing election at which such proposition may be voted upon and the submission of such question by the proper election authorities to the voters of such City; and

Whereas, the City Clerk of the City of Highland Park, with whom said petition was filed, as provided by the statute in such case made and provided, did cause said proposition to be plainly printed upon a separate ballot and used at the election for the election of officers of the City of Highland Park at the general election held in and for said City on April 16, 1935, and

Whereas, at said election the said proposition "Shall the sale at retail of alcoholic liquor be prohibited in Highland Park?"

was voted "Yes" and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

Section 1: That the sale at retail of alcoholic liquor be and the same is hereby prohibited in the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, effective on the 1st day of July and August; 1935.

Section 2: That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to sell at retail or offer for sale at retail or to solicit or receive an order for the sale at retail or to keep or expose for sale at retail of

to keep with the intention of selling at retail any alcoholic liquor in the City of Highland Park.

Section 3: Unless the context otherwise requires, the words and phrases herein defined are used in the Ordinance in the sense given them in the following definitions:

(1) The word "alcohol" means the product of distillation of any fermented liquid, whether rectified or diluted, whatever may be the origin thereof, and includes synthetic ethyl alcohol. It does not include denatured alcohol or wood alcohol.

(2) The word "spirits" means any beverage which contains alcohol obtained by distillation, mixed with water or other substance in solution, and includes brandy, rum, whiskey, gin, or other spirituous liquors, and such liquors when rectified, blended or otherwise mixed with alcohol or other substance.

(3) The word "wine" means any alcohol beverage obtained by the fermentation of the natural contents of fruits or vegetables, containing sugar, including such beverages when fortified by the addition of alcohol or spirits, as above defined.

(4) The word "beer" means a beverage obtained by alcoholic fermentation of grain, malt, and hops in water, and includes, among other things, beer, ale, stout, lager beer, porter and the like.

(5) The phrase "alcoholic liquor" includes the four varieties of liquor above defined, and includes any alcoholic beverage, solid, liquid, or semi-liquid, and capable of being consumed as a beverage by a human being. The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to alcohol used in the manufacture of denatured alcohol, nor to any liquid or solid containing one-half of one per cent, or less, of alcohol by volume. Nor shall the provisions of this ordinance apply to favoring extracts, essences, syrups, or medicinal, mechanical, scientific, culinary or toilet preparations, or food products unfit for beverage purposes, but the provisions of this ordinance shall not be construed to exclude or not apply to alcoholic liquor used in the manufacture, preparation or compounding of such products. None of the provisions of this ordinance shall apply to wine intended for use and used by any church or religious organization for sacramental purposes.

(6) The word "retailer" means a person who sells, or offers for sale, alcoholic liquor for use or consumption and not for resale in any form.

(7) The word "sell at retail" and "sale at retail" refer to and mean sale for use or consumption and not for resale in any form.

(8) The word "sale" means any transfer, exchange or barter in any manner or by means whatsoever for a consideration, and includes and means all sales made by any person, whether principal, proprietor, agent, servant or employee.

(9) The words "to sell" include to solicit or receive an order for, to keep or expose for sale and to keep with intent to sell.

(10) The word "club" means a corporation, organization or association of persons organized for the purpose of promoting the sale of alcoholic liquors, kept, used and maintained by its members through the payment of annual dues and owning, hiring or leasing a building or space in a building, of such extent and character as may be suitable and adequate for the reasonable and comfortable use and accommodation of its members and their guests.

Section 4: That the giving away or delivery of any alcoholic liquor for the purpose of evading any provision of this ordinance or the taking of orders or the making of agreements within the City of Highland Park for the sale or delivery of any alcoholic liquor, or other shift or device to evade any provision of this ordinance, shall be held to be an unlawful selling.

Section 5: That all places where alcoholic liquor is sold in violation of any provision of this ordinance shall be taken and held and are hereby declared to be common nuisances and may be abated as such.

Section 6: That the provisions and sections of this ordinance shall be deemed to be separate and the invalidity of any portion of this ordinance shall not affect the validity of the remainder.

Section 7: That any person, firm or corporation violating any provision of this ordinance shall be fined not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each offense.
