During 1924 approximately 80 per cent of the tax extension of \$4,866,454.06 were collected. Taxes forfeited by property owners last year totalled \$734,706.65, and there is being held up an amount of taxes pending final settlement of court litigation.

. Tax experts have estimated that the interest payments and provisions for the retirement of the funding bonds would cost the taxpayers of the county less than if the present system of trading on extended credit were continued. The 4 per cent funding bonds will call for a one cent levy on each \$100 valuation. The resolution for the issuance of the bond sets up the required amounts levied from 1935 to 1953 for the interest pawment and the retirement of the bonds.




