

Memorial Program To Honor Jane Addams

Plans for the memorial meeting honoring the late Jane Addams, to be held in Chicago, Sept. 6, at 4:30 p.m. in Grant Park have been completed. The location will be south of the Lincoln monument adjacent to Van Buren street. Chairs will be provided for the large crowd expected to attend.

Similar memorial meetings to honor Miss Addams will be held in more than 25 American cities as well as many others in foreign countries, according to Miss Louise Wier, Washington, D.C., U. S. organizer for the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom, under whose auspices these ceremonies are being held.

A feature of the Chicago program will be an international radio broadcast, five to five-thirty p.m. daylight saving time. The first 15 minutes of this time to be devoted to a broadcast of the Chicago and New York programs directly to Geneva, where a similar meeting will be in progress. The remaining time allotted will be in a broadcast of part of the Geneva program directly to the Chicago assemblage in Grant Park. The National Broadcasting company will be in charge of this feature.

Speakers to be heard in the international network from New York City will be Hannah Clothier Hull, national president, Women's International League for Peace and Freedom; Dr. Alice Hamilton, medical faculty, Harvard university and Miss Lillian Wald, nationally known social service authority. From the Chicago meeting will be heard, Dr. Mary Woolley, president, Mount Holyoke college and U. S. delegate to the World Disarmament Confer-

ence; Federal Judge Florence Allen, Ohio Agnes Nestor, president, Woman's Trade Union League of Chicago; Catharine Waugh McCulloch and the Hull House chorus.

Milwaukee and Madison, Wisconsin branches of the league, Miss Wier said are planning to send large delegations to participate in the local program. Foreign language groups in this area are actively assisting the committee for the success of the affair. The ceremonies will close with a processional of the flags of all nations. Miss Amelia Sears is chairman of arrangements.

North Western Offers Low-Rate Bus Tickets

Bus commutation tickets—"Twin Brothers" to the regular Chicago & North Western railway 25 and 54 ride suburban multiple ride past-board—were introduced September 1, by the North Western in cooperation with the Chicago Motor Coach company. The new arrangement allows regular riders of buses between the Madison street station and the loop and near north side to save six cents a day.

Ticket agents at North Western suburban stations and at the downtown station will sell these 25 and 54 ride bus tickets in connection with the sale of the corresponding railroad commutation tickets. The same way as the rail ticket—the 25 bus tickets will be honored in the ride being good for one year and the 54 ride being good for one month's use by the individual purchasing. The rate of the bus tickets will make the rides seven cents each on these tickets.

The bus tickets will be honored in the district bounded by North avenue, Cermak road, Western avenue and the lake.

This new arrangement comes just after the introduction of new style equipment of streamlined design by the Chicago Motor Coach company on routes 40, 43, 57 and 42 serving the North Western station.

Jim McMillen To Meet "Crybaby" Zaharias

The throngs of local sport lovers who have been enjoying the semi-monthly all-star professional heavy-weight wrestling cards at the Round Lake Haunted House Open-Air Sports Arena will get their last glimpse of the leading wrestlers in action Friday night, Sept. 6. To close the season promoter "Peg" Behning and matchmaker Les White have prepared what appears on paper to be the finest card of the entire season.

In the main event Jimmy McMillen, local boy who made good in a big way in professional wrestling and is now considered by the athletic commissions to be the number one contender for the world's championship, will pit scientific wrestling and a famous flying tackle against the most vicious wrestler in the game, "Crybaby" George Zaharias, Colorado Greek title holder. They will wrestle one fall to a finish with a sixty minute time limit, as per rules of the Illinois Athletic Commission.

Both McMillen and Zaharias are as close to the top as any wrestler can ever hope to get, and the winner of this match will be placing himself in a spot where he can demand a match for the title with Danno O'Mahoney, the champion. To offset Zaharias' weight advantage of twenty-five pounds, McMillen has three added years of wrestling experience, and to coup with the "Crybaby's" rough and tough tactics, Mac has one of the most effective flying tackles in the game.

This match is as much out of place at so small an arena, and at such low prices as a match between Joe Louis and Max Baer would be at Round Lake, however, it will not be gold that these two stars are battling for Friday night, but they will be fighting for a chance at the world's title, worth a quarter of a million dollars to the man who can get it.

In the semi-windup scheduled for thirty minutes, Lou Plummer, Waukegan's tough guy and claimant to the Lake County championship, will go against Ray Richards, Chicago's Bear's football star and a leading pro wrestler. The pair have never met before and their bout may steal the show from the main go. Two attractive preliminary matches will complete the card, Bobby Bruns, Lake Villa heavyweight sensation, will be in action against a worthy opponent, and Andy Dahl, 1935 Big Ten wrestling champion from the University of Illinois and a star tackle on the Illini football squad, will make his second pro start against some other local favorite.

Plenty of good tickets available at the box-office Friday night. In case of rain the card will be staged the following night.

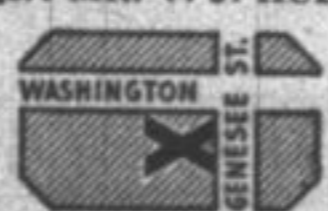
