Jack Hylton To Be on Radio Program for Standard Oil Company

Jack Hylton, Europe's most famous bandmaster, and his noted orchestra and revue, who will arrive in the United States on the Normandie Oct. 21, have been engaged for a series of radio programs by the Standard Oil Company of Indiana.

Hylton and his musical troupe, according to present plans, will come to Chicago immediately after their arrival in New York to begin the series of programs which will be broadcast for twenty-six weeks over the midwest network of the Columbia broadcasting system, it was announced.

The visit was arranged by the Music Corporation of America in cooperation with the Standard Oil Company of Indiana and will be Hylton's first musical tour of America, it was stated.

According to musical observers, Hylton's organization is the most popular orchestra on the Continent, and has appeared with marked success in many European cities.

The orchestra leader already has gained wide recognition in this country through his phonograph records, many of which have been used on the air, and for having led the first English band to broadcast to America. He is noted particularly for his original interpretations of modern music.

After a stay in Chicago, Hylton and his troupe, will appear in other middle western cities, it was stated.

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Maurice L. Rothschild Purchases Waukegan Tax Anticipation Warrants

Waukegan officials last Saturday, August 31, sold the entire issue of \$50,000 in 1935 tax anticipation warrants to Maurice L. Rothschild of Highland Park and Chicago at an interest rate of 3 1/2 per cent.

Competitive bidding and the refusal of city officials to pay an interest rate higher than that absolutely necessary resulted in the saving. Initial offers ranged from 6 per cent downward to the offer of 3 1/2 per cent by Mr. Rothschild.

Mr. Rothschild purchased the same amount of warrants last year, representing all of the writs that were sold outside of the corporation of Waukegan.

William R. Behanna, Waukegan attorney and former corporation counsel of that city, represented Mr. Rothschild in the negotiations.

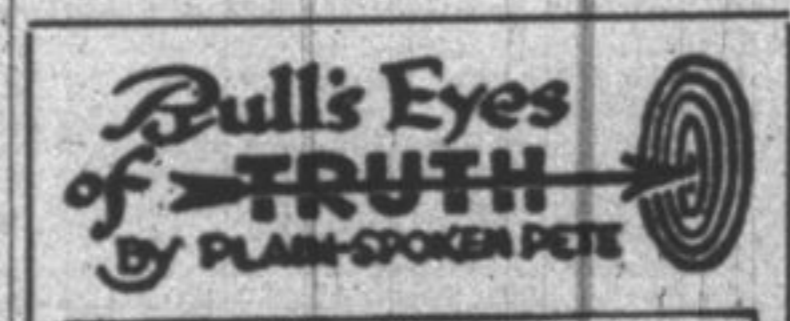
If you're not Scandinavian, you probably are not acquainted with that famous feature of Swedish dining—the Smorgasbord.

"Smorgas" means bread and butter, "bord" means table. But the appetizers which are served on this "bread-and-butter table" are of such an amazing variety and scope that the Smorgasbord may serve as a complete meal in itself.

Guests help themselves from the Smorgasbord before taking their places at the main dining table, selecting as many portions of the highly flavored foods as the large plates specially provided will make room for.

Selecting from the Smorgasbord is an exciting experience. There are perhaps thirty or fifty dishes to spur your appetite: molds of aspic, revealing glimpses of cold cooked chicken, lobster, duck or turkey or fillets of pork or veal; salads of cold cubed vegetables, combined with fish and special dressings; a variety of tempting relishes and pickles; sardines and anchovies in bland oil; pink Swedish caviar, stuffed eggs, crisp cucumbers, radishes and olives; thin slices of cold, light meats, chicken, beef, tongue, boiled ham and pate de foie gras; gleaming slices of head cheese garnished with pickled beets; chilled tomatoes stuffed with fruit and vegetables; clam

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shells filled with fish and liver pastes; an assortment of cheeses; cold herring salad garnished with hard-cooked eggs.

There are delicious hot entrees, too, which make the Smorgasbord even more complete as a meal: broiled sausages, meat balls, olives wrapped in bacon, creamed lobster and mushrooms in pastry shells.

The Smorgasbord is practical for us to serve ourselves, a delightfully "different" way of entertaining when table service and dining space are limited, for it can be made as simple or as elaborate as desired.

- Chicken in Aspic: 1 Plump chicken, Water, Salt, 1 Carrot, 1 Bay leaf, Aspic Jelly, 3 1/2 Cups chicken stock, 1 Ounce gelatine

- White of 1 egg, 1 Small can green peas, 1/2 Tablespoon Brandy Extract.

The chicken should be plucked, singed and cleaned and allowed to soak in cold water for a few hours. Take fresh water, boil the seasonings in it and taste carefully.

Skin the chicken, and free it from the bones by cutting it into slices. Arrange it in the aspic, using either one large mould or several small ones to hold it.

- Sylta: 1/2 lb. veal, 1/2 lb. pork, 1 pork shank, 1/2 Tablespoon salt, 3 whole black peppers, 3 bay leaves, 1 teaspoon paprika

Put meat in pot with water enough to just cover, add black peppers, salt thyme, pakrika, and bay leaves, and boil slowly for 1 1/2 to 2 hours.

To serve: Turn out of mould, cut in slices, and serve with it boiled in vinegar. This is served as an hors d'oeuvre.
