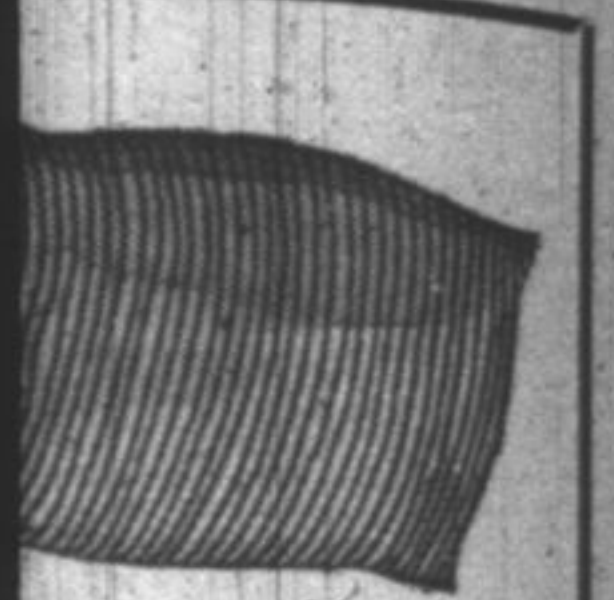
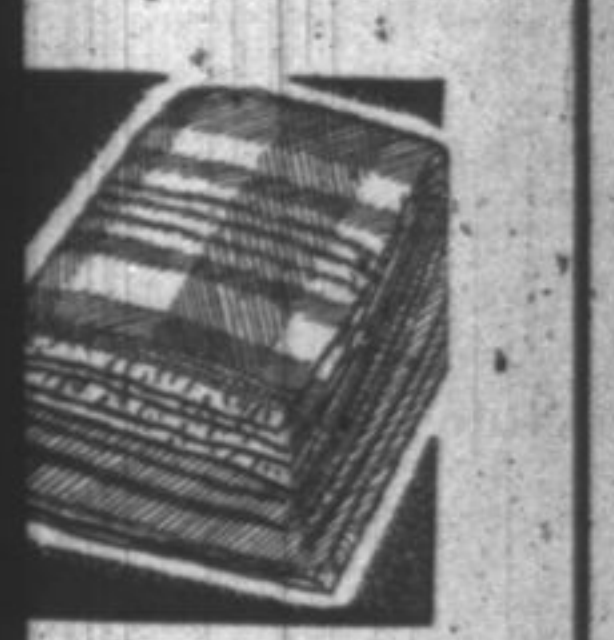

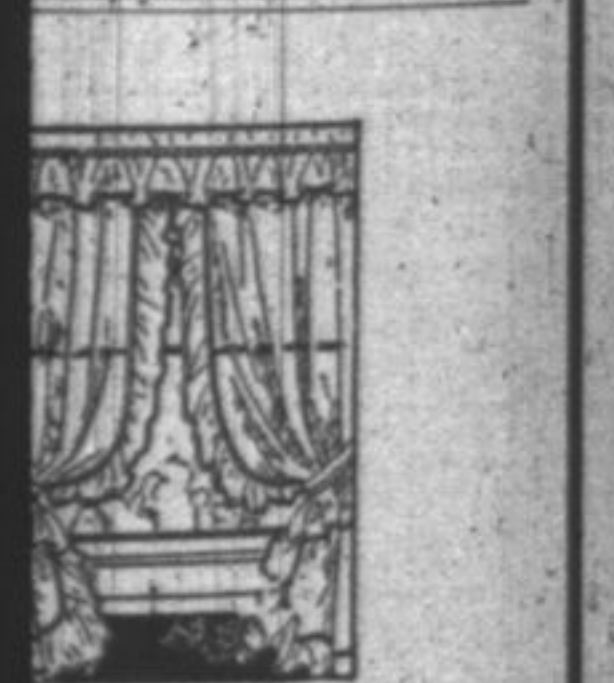

A PROCLAMATION
 Constitution Day, Tuesday,
 September 17

WHEREAS, seven score and eight years ago the American nation was given life by the forming and signing of the constitution, and
 WHEREAS, this great document embodies the principles of freedom and constitutes a final refuge for every human right enjoyed by any citizen, and
 WHEREAS, the fundamental principles of the constitution have been the source and the inspiration for the growth of this vast civilization economically and politically, and
 WHEREAS, the preceding generations have handed down to us intact the ideals and theories of government by laws and not by men as a guarantee against the ravages of dictatorships which harass other nations today, and
 WHEREAS, throughout the nation many civic and patriotic organizations will participate in patriotic exercises on September 17,
 THEREFORE, I, WM. M. DOOLEY, Mayor of the City of Highland Park, designate the period from September 17th to 21st inclusive to be set aside for the citizens of this municipality to commemorate in fitting and proper manner the signing of the Constitution to the end that we may dedicate ourselves anew to the constant protection and defense of this great document of freedom.

The Forum Council of the North Shore Congregation Israel begins its fifth annual series of lectures in October. The men and women who have been engaged to speak here are eminent authorities in their respective fields, unusually well qualified to discuss the subjects selected. The entire program, we are told, gives promise of being the most interesting of any heretofore offered.
 The Honorable Miss Frances Perkins, Secretary of Labor, will open the series Monday evening, Oct. 21, with a discussion of "The New Challenge to Industry."
 Former governor and U. S. Senator Henry G. Allen of Kansas, journalist and newspaper publisher, will speak Nov. 24, on "The Significance of British Recovery."
 Dr. Samuel D. Schmalhausen, of New York, prominent psycho-analyst and author, Dec. 17, will present "Human Nature in an Inhuman World."
 Edwin R. Embree, president of the Julius Rosenwald Fund, student of conditions in the Orient and islands of the Pacific, will speak Jan. 7, on "After Western Civilization What?"
 Marvin Lowenthal, editor, foreign correspondent, publicist and author, Jan. 28, will discuss "Must Europe Go to War?"
 Dr. Sigmund Spaeth, speaker and writer on music, author of "The Art of Enjoying Music," will present on Feb. 25, his "Adventures as a Tune Detective."
 Miss Carla Orlando, daughter of Italy's wartime premier, will speak on March 25 for and against "Fascism in Italy."
 Dr. Stephen Leacock, professor at

McGill University, Montreal, a well known historian, author and humorist, on April 28, will present the final address of the series, "Literature and Progress."
 All lectures will be delivered in the auditorium of the temple, Lincoln and Vernon avenues, Glencoe. There will be informal discussion following each lecture, in which the audience is invited to join. It will be noted that altho the number of lectures this season has been increased from the usual six to eight, the price of the subscription ticket for the entire season remains the same as last year.
