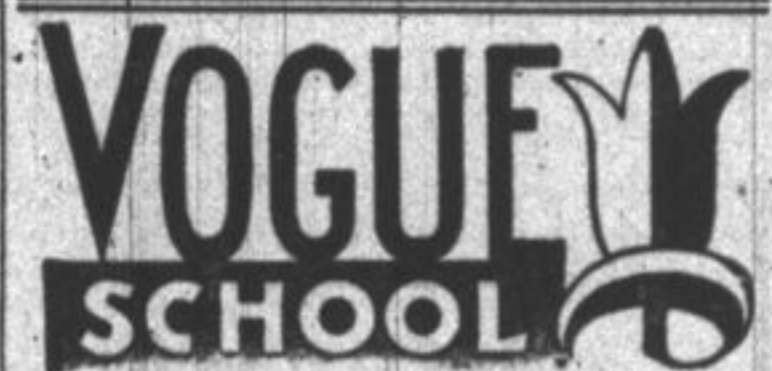

### Wrongful Use of Taxation Power Is Assailed by Educator

Washington—(IPS)—The use of taxing power by the federal government to bring about social changes was assailed in a recent address by Dr. Nicholas Murray Butler, president of Columbia University, New York, who called it dangerous to liberty and asserted it was undermining the constitution.

Dr. Butler's address, extending also to a criticism of regimentation of industry and agriculture, was entitled "Is Thomas Jefferson the Forgotten Man?"

The educator warned that "a vengeful desire" by the government to place inordinately high taxes on personal and corporate incomes and on personal estates would soon be
