

WOMEN VOTERS TO DISCUSS BUDGET

Special Meeting to Be Held Wednesday Morning September 25

Mrs. Jay Glidden, president of the Highland Park League of Women Voters, has called a special meeting of the league for the purpose of discussing the budget for the coming year and of voting upon a change in dues. The meeting will be held promptly at 10:30 Wednesday morning, September 25, at Mrs. Glidden's home, 6 Dale avenue. Mrs. Frank Hixon, president of the state league, has promised to be present, and it is hoped that Mrs. Arthur McGeech of Milwaukee, who is the national regional director for this district, will also be able to attend.

The league anticipates an active and interesting year. Both national and state organizations are planning intensive campaigns on the league's civil service program. The following communication was recently received from the national league headquarters:

"Wanted: A slogan—for the National League of Women Voters to use in awakening the public to the need of trained personnel in government.

"Prizes: First prize for the best slogan, \$25; second prize for the next best, \$10.

"Date: All slogans must be in the mail by midnight October 31, 1935.

"Rules: One person may send as many slogans as he or she wishes. Slogans should be typed on a piece of plain paper, placed in a plain envelope, and this unmarked envelope enclosed in a larger mailing envelope with the name and address of the contestant on it, and sent to Slogan Contest Editor, National League of Women Voters, 726 Jackson place, Washington, D. C. Each entry will be given a number, which will be placed on the inside plain envelope. This number, with the name of the contestant, will be filed in a book. The judges will be unaware of the identity of the contestants.

"Judges: The judges will be announced at a later date.

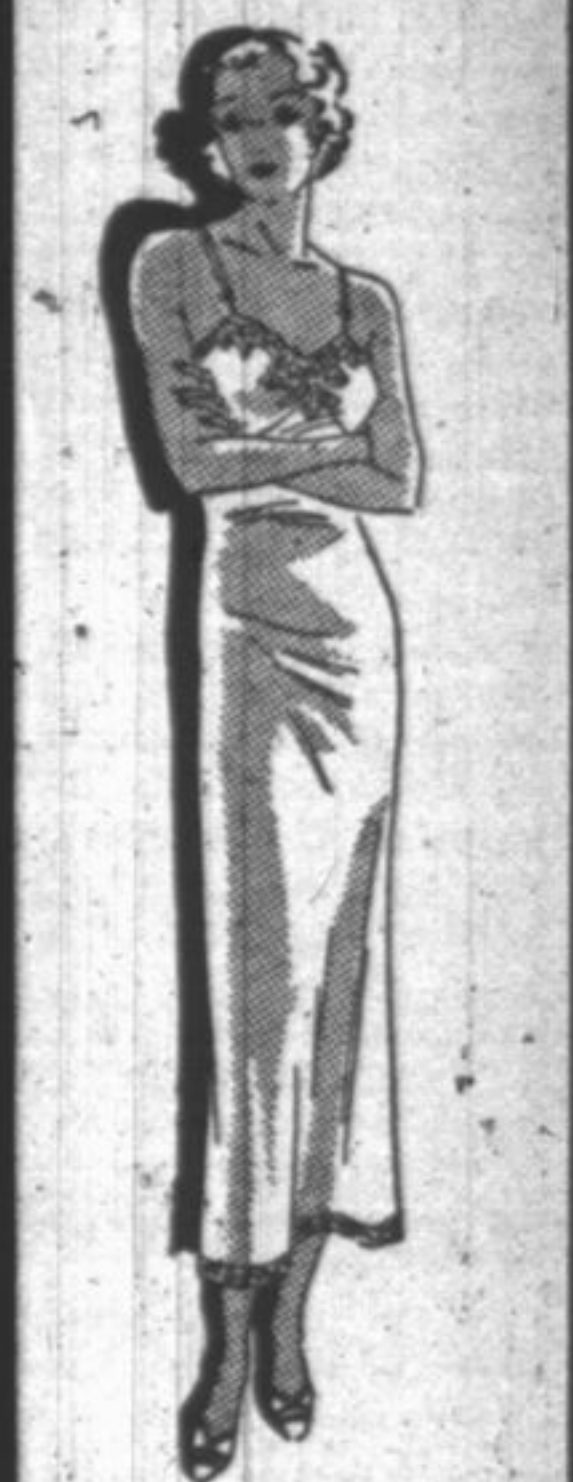
