GEORGE SCHUCHENPFLUG MAKES REPORT

Mr. George Schuchenspflug (XYZ) chairman of the camping committee of the North Shore Area Council this week sent his report to all executive board members and other interested Scouts covering the activities at Camp Makajawa in the season of 1935. Besides the two awards mentioned above the following information was contained in the report:

During the season there were 50 scouts awarded second class advancement 25 first class 9 star scout 18 life scouts 4 eagle and 15 eagle scouts. Applying on that advancement were also 10 merit badges earned during the 6-week period. This in comparison with 478 in 1934, and 286 in 1933.

On the water front the following swimming advancement was recorded: 32 scouts received their Junior Red Cross life saving award and five their Red Cross life saving award. Probably the most remarkable accomplishment of the waterfront was the fact that under the leadership of Dick Weisman of Highland Park, was the making of 64 scouts to swim their first advancement. 54 of these largest number of non-swimmers ever to present themselves for instruction and 64 out of 64 were taught to swim at least fifty feet, which is the American Red Cross requirement for "beginners."

Continuing with court of honor report: 34 scouts and leaders were initiated into the noble honor of the Order of the Arrow, national brotherhood of honor campers, by Scouts of America. George Hin was elected by the national council of the chief of the Makajawa Tribe which also consisted 12 in the brotherhood honor and three into the vigil honor. Those who received the vigil honor were Dick Weisman, waterfront director; J. R. Jackson, commissioner of the North Shore Area Council; and Merrill Radloff, Scoutmaster of Troop T, Libertyville.

MERIT BADGE SHOW TO HAVE OVER FIFTY BOOTHS

The following committees have been appointed to administer the business of the show: General, participation, publicity, prizes and awards, ticket sales, reception, little theatre, business management, information and instruction concessions. Complete personnel of these committees has not been given out, but will be soon.

The North Shore Area Council is responsible for demonstrating the following merit badges: athletics, cycling, forestry, conservation, canoeing, first aid, reptile study, taxidermy, pioneering, dairying, foundry, chemistry, carpentry, surveying, bird study, bee-keeping, masonry, reading, wood serving and mechanical drawing. It also is responsible for demonstrating requirements of second class, the sea scout booth, cubbing booth, and the booth for the senior program. Many of the merit badges have been accepted by the troops.

Tickets were distributed this week throughout the entire area of the three councils and will be sold by the scouts from now until the time of the show. Children between the ages of 9 and 15 are to be admitted free.
