The sponsors would like to have singers, yodelers, guitar and banjo players, old time fiddlers, accordion players, ect. attend. Several good impersonators are also wanted.

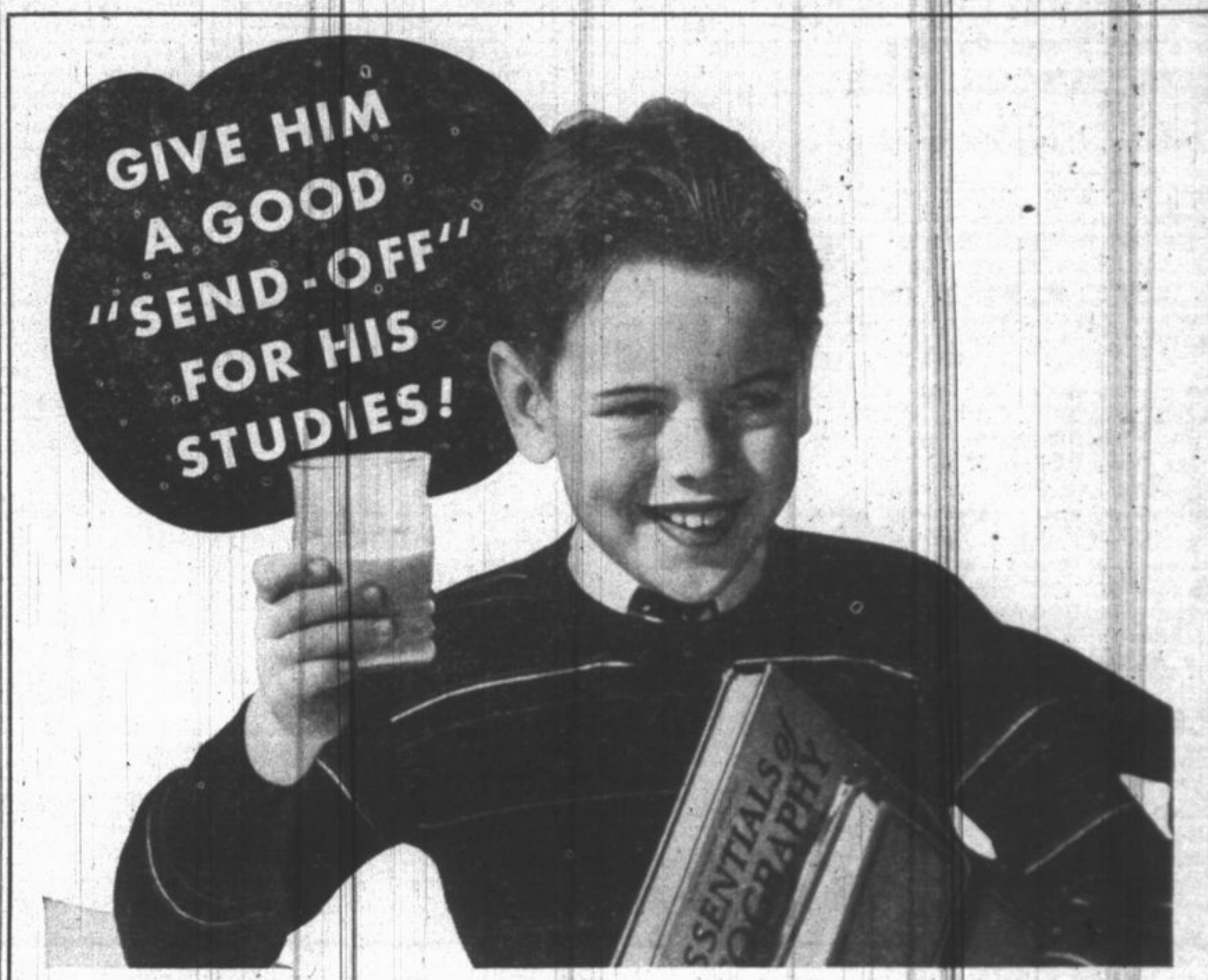
