"Probation After Death" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, October 27.

The Golden Text was, "Blessed is the man that endureth temptation: for when he is tried, he shall receive the crown of life, which the Lord hath promised to them that love him" (James 1:12).

Among the citations which comprised the Lesson-Sermon was the following from the Bible: "If the clouds be full of rain, they empty themselves upon the earth; and if the tree fall toward the south, or toward the north, there it shall be" (Ecclesiastes 11:3).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "In the place where the tree falleth, there it shall be." So we read in Ecclesiastes. This text has been transformed into the popular proverb, "As man falleth asleep, so shall he awake." As death findeth mortal man, so shall he be after death, until probation and growth shall effect the needed change" (p. 291).
