**Charles P. Taft To Be Sunday Club Speaker**

Next Sunday, Dec. 15th, Charles P. Taft, Cincinnati, will speak before the Chicago Sunday Evening club, repeating the experience of his father who, 25 years ago, when president of the United States, was introduced from the same platform by Clifford W. Barnes.

"Young Taft," says Mr. Barnes, "is not only active in bringing about better politics, but is taking the place of a real leader in promoting Christian work among business men." He is active in a laymen's religious movement promoted by the Protestant Episcopal church.

Mr. Taft published a reference volume concerning the Cincinnati experiment with the City Manager idea, and his findings are being very helpful to the group in Chicago now concerned with promoting this plan for our own city.

The subject he has chosen for his talk before the club is "The Religion of the Man on the Street." Members of the Chicago Association of Commerce will be special guests, and the Glee club of that organization will give a special program at 7 o'clock. Angus Hibbard, veteran song leader, has been asked to lead the crowd in singing the patriotic song he composed for the association: "Hail! Chicago!" At 7:30 Mr. Barnes will give an informal Bible talk on "Old Hymns and Their Message," the subject of an interesting series giving the history, meaning and influence of the hymns of all times and nations.
