Florida Sunbeam Offers Comfortable Trip To Florida

The New York Central system, the Southern Railway System and the Seaboard Air Line railway have pooled their resources to provide a most convenient daily service from Chicago to both coasts of Florida by way of the Highland and Lake district of Central Florida.

The Florida Sunbeam will be completely air-conditioned and will leave Chicago very late in the evening, arriving at Tampa and St. Petersburg in the early forenoon, and at West Palm Beach and Miami before noon on the second day.

In addition to the new Florida Sunbeam, the Royal Palm and the Ponce de Leon will continue daily service to Florida from Chicago.

Passengers to Florida may now take along their automobiles by fast freight, without delay of crating. When two or more passengers travel in Pullman cars the total cost for transportation of an automobile to Florida is only one extra passenger ticket.

Special low round trip fares will continue in effect throughout the Florida winter season. These tickets are good for either long or short visits.

All Florida trains from Chicago on the New York Central system depart from Central Station, Michigan avenue and Roosevelt road.
