

The methods of training a partially grown dog are practically the same as those used in training a younger pup, though it is reasonable to expect that more intelligence. will be shown on the part of an older dog, thus calling for the expenditure of less energy and labor during the process. In any case, they involve patience and insistence on the part of the trainer. The upper hand must always be maintained, though gentleness, rather than brutality should be employed in obtaining obedience.

A great deal of personal judgment must be brought into play when handling any animal, especially the dog, for there are no set rules to follow. Each case will vary with the animal, owner, and environmental conditions.
