

# The Recipe Box

With the holidays over, we are at last able to settle back and start all over again planning meals. Some of our housewives will continue to serve the same old meals—but the modern housewife has already made her new year's resolution to plan new meals for the coming year. To help our readers who have made this resolution, the Recipe Box will offer new, attractive and delicious meals and recipes in future issues.

In my meanderings about your local grocery stores, I find many new products on the market, for instance, Powdered Mushrooms, what an excellent idea for gravies and sauces and then too, I find Garlic and Onion juice in bottles, to eliminate the muss and disagreeable odors left on hands, knives and tables, the juices have shaker tops that deposit a drop at a time. Your grocer has these items and if you can't find them drop me a line and I'll tell you where you can find them.

Many requests have been made for meat loaves, appetizers and Sunday night suppers. This issue is devoted to meat loaves and appetizers. These meat loaf recipes were collected from all parts of the country and some are from famous chefs.

**Veal Loaf**  
3 lbs. ground veal  
1/2 lb. ground ham or salt pork  
1/2 cup soft, stale bread crumbs  
2 tsp. lemon juice  
1 tsp. minced onion  
1 tsp. minced parsley  
1 egg, slightly beaten  
1/2 cup meat stock or milk  
1 1/2 tsp. Morton's seasoning  
Combine materials, mix thoroughly and add meat stock or milk to moisten. Pack firmly into a bread pan. Bake 2 1/2 hours in a moderate oven, 350 degrees F, or until well browned. Remove from pan and serve with tomato sauce.

**Beef Loaf, Savarin**  
3 lbs. raw beef  
1 cup bread crumbs  
1 egg  
1/2 tsp. pepper

1/2 lb. salt pork  
1 cup milk  
1 tblsp. salt  
1 medium onion  
2 tblsp. chopped parsley  
Put beef and pork through food chopper and mix with other ingredients. Pack firmly in bread pan and bake in oven for 2 1/2 to 3 hours. Serve with vegetables or spaghetti.

**Ham Loaf with Pineapple**  
1 lb. cured raw ham  
2 cups rice flakes  
1/2 lb. fresh pork  
1 tea. Worcestershire sauce  
1 egg  
Pepper, salt, to taste  
Sliced pineapple  
1/4 cup milk  
Flour

Have ham and pork ground together twice. Mix all ingredients except flour and pineapple together thoroughly. Pat into a loaf; place in greased roaster and sprinkle with flour. Seal in hot oven 500 degrees F, until brown. Pour 1/2 cupful of water around loaf, cover and continue cooking in a moderate oven 375 degrees F, for about 1 hour. After the first half hour place slices of pineapple over the top of loaf and allow to brown delicately.

**Sausage Loaf**  
2 lbs. pork sausage meat  
1 cup bread crumbs  
1 egg, slightly beaten  
1/2 cup milk or water  
4 tsp. Morton's seasoning  
Mix sausage meat and seasonings thoroughly, add remaining materials, mix well, shape into a roll. Place in roasting pan and bake in moderate oven 350 degrees F, for 1 1/2 hours, basting occasionally. Serve with apple rings or macaroni and tomato sauce.

**Novel Meat Loaf**  
Mix together the following:  
2 lbs. ground beef  
2 tblsp. chopped onion  
2 tea. salt  
1/2 tea. pepper  
1/2 cup evaporated milk  
When well mixed, put on a sheet of

waxed paper and pat out to an oblong about 8 inches by 12 inches, 1/2 inch thick. Beat together until light and fluffy;  
3 cups hot mashed potatoes  
Few grains pepper  
1 tea. salt  
1/2 cup evaporated milk  
Form into a roll about 4 inches thick and nearly as long as the meat and place in the center of the oblong. With the aid of the wax paper, wrap the meat around the potatoes. Remove paper and put roll in greased baking pan, and bake in hot oven 400 degrees F about 45 minutes or until brown. Serves 6.

**Dried Beef and Roquefort**  
Spread one end of a piece of dried beef with thick layer of soft roquefort cheese. Roll tightly and fasten with toothpick.

**Pecan Balls**  
Roll any variety of soft cheese into ball one inch in diameter. Press two large pecans into opposite sides.

**Flaked Crab Meat**  
Flake crab meat with mushrooms, pimiento, green pepper (all of which has been chopped fine) add cream cheese or salad dressing, and mix well. Spread on crackers or rounds of toast.

**Appetizer Delight**  
Hard cooked egg, salt, pepper, cayenne salad dressing and 1 tea. curry powder. Spread on soda crackers, Crax or Ritz.



**Prunes Stuffed with Cream Cheese**  
Steam medium sized prunes until tender, remove pits. Stuff with cream cheese.

**Pork Sausage Appetizers**  
Make very tiny pork sausage meat balls, cook slowly until well done. Spear with toothpick and serve with slice of stuffed olive which has been placed on the same toothpick.

**Biscuit-Sausage Appetizers**  
Make very small, rather thick, baking powder biscuits. Hollow out center (like tart) and fill with cooked sausage meat.

**Pimiento Carrots**  
Form pimiento cheese into tiny cones. Insert bit of parsley in large end for leaves.

## E. L. Manning to Speak on "Adventures in Science"

On January 7 a miniature laboratory of science will be shown to members of the Chicago Engineers club when Ellis L. Manning, of the General Electric research laboratory at Schenectady will deliver his graphic presentation, "Adventures in Science."

The demonstration will present a faithful series of glimpses of the most recent developments in one of the country's better-known research institutions. It will introduce the audience to the mysterious electron, acquaint it with microamperes, and reveal the workings of cathode rays. Since Mr. Manning is himself a research man, it will be his objective to create a better understanding of the methods, objective, and philosophy of the research scientist.

He will bring to the demonstration various scientific "gadgets" and will perform a repertoire of experiments involving vacuum tubes of different types, especially the comparatively new and versatile Thyatron, certain chemical gases, and high frequency radiations, thus illustrating the new kind of tools being fashioned for the convenience of a world fast becoming electrical in everything it does.

## Rev. William Temple To Be Speaker On Sunday Club Program

Residents of the north shore will have an opportunity to hear the renowned Most Reverend William Temple, Archbishop of York and Primate of England, at the Chicago Sunday Evening Club in Orchestra Hall, where he will make his first public appearance in Chicago on Jan. 5.

Bishop George Craig Stewart, head of the Chicago diocese; Lewis Bernays, British consul general; Edward L. Ryerson, Jr., and other prominent laymen and ministers from churches of all denominations, will have seats on the stage to hear the archbishop speak on "Christian Unity." Clifford W. Barnes will preside.

The Archbishop of York has long been an international figure in religious affairs, as chairman of the World Conference on Faith and Order, and as leader in better housing projects in England. He was given world wide publicity at the time of the marriage of Princess Marina and Prince George at whose wedding he officiated with the Archbishop of Canterbury.

This is his first visit to America. Last week he spoke at the convention of the Student Volunteer Movement. Society leaders and church dignitaries are uniting to honor and entertain England's primate during his short stay in Chicago.

Arthur Kraft will be soloist with the choir of 125 at this Jan. 5 service. Selections will include Mendelssohn's "O Come Let Us Worship," Pache's "The New Year," Foote's "God Is Our Refuge," and "Holy, Holy" from Gounod's St. Cecilia's mass. At 7:15 the choir of St. Chrysostom's church, under the direction of Harold B. Simonds, will give a special program. Carl Pfau will lead the congregational singing.
