

### NEUTRALITY QUESTION TO BE DISCUSSED

#### Three Speakers To Explain Angles of Question at Y.W.C.A.

Three angles of the neutrality question will be discussed by Prof. S. A. Hartzo, head of the political science department of Lake Forest College; Mrs. Clifton Utley, representative of the public affairs committee of the Chicago YWCA, in the field of international relations; and Elbridge Bancroft Pierce, member of the law firm of Gordon, and Pierce and Edmonds, and a director of the Japan-American Society, at the Highland Park YWCA, 374 Laurel Avenue, on Tuesday evening Jan. 28, at 8 o'clock.

Prof. Hartzo will give the history of neutrality showing how it has affected trade and other relations between the nations of the world. Mrs. Utley, in reviewing conditions leading up to our country's present bases, and various problems growing out of the world war. Mr. Pierce will examine proposed neutrality legislation pointing out the main features of bills and amendments now being considered.

The public is invited to attend this three point discussion and to ask questions or bring up additional facts. At the close of open discussion the findings of the evening will be summarized. Suggestions for further topics for informal forums or round table discussions will be presented by Edith Lovejoy Pierce, chairman of the public affairs committee of the Highland Park "Y."

This is the first community round table on topics of concern to every citizen which the leadership council, composed of representatives from the various churches and all groups within the YWCA, is sponsoring. Mrs. Corliss Anderson, as chairman of the recently organized leadership council, explains the project by saying: "The Young Women's Christian Association is eager to help create public opinion based on actual facts, rather than propaganda. One of the purposes of the leadership council is to make a study of public affairs in order that we may all function more intelligently as Christian citizens."

Mrs. Frederick Paist, national president of the YWCA, says "As an international organization we have a responsibility to the young people of all races. To keep informed on subjects of vital concern to youth, even though they may often be controversial, is the work of the public affairs committees throughout the nation."

The Tuesday night meeting is free. Men, women, high school and college students are urged to attend so that the audience may be truly representative.

#### Florida Fruit Company Takes Over Hanauer's

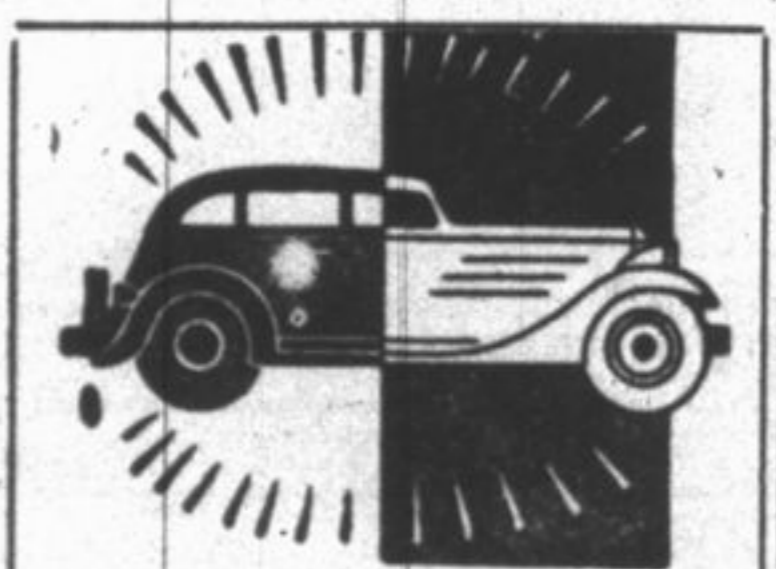

### FHA To Finance Ten Highland Park Homes

Ten homes, financed through the FHA, will be built on the 70 acre tract known as Highland Park Woodlands in Highland Park, it has been announced by the Frederick H. Bartlett Realty company.

Recently acquired by the Bartlett company, the property is located in the northwest section of Highland Park, west of Highwood, and is expected to be formally opened in the spring. Two homes have been completed at present and a third is now under construction.

While details have not been announced, it is understood the building program will be confined almost entirely to low cost homes. From plans by Skidmore & Owings, architects, the houses will be built along lines which provide for the use of a new type of plywood exteriors. The home now being built will contain four rooms. The conventional basement is eliminated and utility rooms are located on the first floor.

### Furniture Needed for Girl Scouts New House

What every Girl Scout has been wanting for years, and what national research into Girl Scout needs declares is the one thing needed to make the scouting program complete, has been made possible. The Skokie Area Girl Scouts are the proud possessors of a little house, donated to them by the Forest Preserve Board for an indefinite period.

The house, which is well built and in good condition, is located in the Forest Preserve at Northbrook, on Waukegan Road, just north of Dundee, with ample space around it for a garden and for all the outdoor sports and activities which are the backbone of scouting.

The immediate problem at hand is the furnishing, which the Girl Scout council hopes will be accomplished by donations from scout parents and friends. All the funds received from the community chest are absorbed by the regular scout program, so even for such a vital a need as this, there is no available money. Highland Park, Glencoe, and Winnetka troops will each be responsible for part of the furnishing. Anyone having old furniture to contribute is asked to telephone Mrs. Walter Neisser, at Highland Park 412, who will have it called for.

The council is hoping also that a number of scout fathers will volunteer their help in building and repairing furniture, and in equipping the house with shelves and other necessities.

The house is the answer to many Girl Scout needs, with a kitchen where they can cook, bedrooms where they can sleep on week-ends, a garden where they can grow flowers and vegetables, and the whole forest preserve where they can hike. During the summer it will be an ideal site for a Girl Scout day camp which was held this year at Sunset Park.
