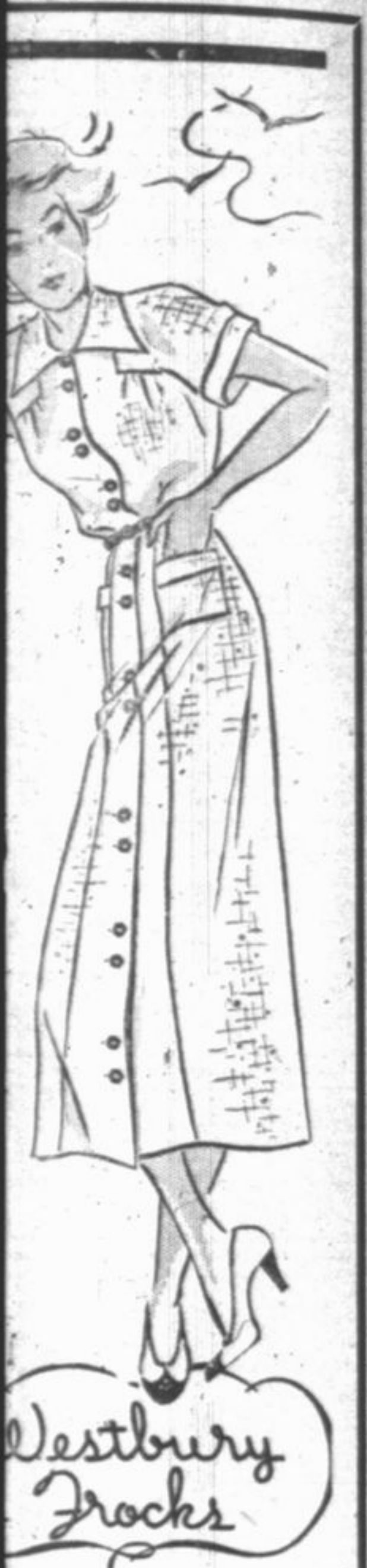

Stamp Facts

Count Casimir Pulaski was honored by the issuing of this stamp on January 16, 1931, (just five years ago), to commemorate the 150th anniversary of his death. While his death occurred on October 11, 1779, the delay in issuing this stamp was due to the unwillingness of the Postmaster General to put out another commemorative, although first requested to do so by a resolution of Congress in 1929.

In his fight against Russia, Count Pulaski lost everything for the freedom of Poland, so he came to America in 1777 and enlisted as a voluntary officer in the Revolutionary forces. He was made a brigadier general for his conspicuous bravery at the battle of Brandywine. He later organized and led a command of his own against the British at Savannah. In this battle he was mortally wounded and died a few days later on board an American vessel. He was buried at sea as one of our American heroes.

The stamp issued is of the 2 cent variety. The portrait on this stamp was taken from an etching by H. B. Hall, in Jones "History of Georgia." It was issued as flat plate, perforation 11, no watermark and is recorded in carmine rose, bright carmine rose, deep carmine rose and carmine lake, with no known minor varieties. 96,559,400 stamps were issued from plates 20416 to 20427.

First day covers are from Buffalo, Brooklyn and New York, Chicago, Gary and South Bend, Indiana, Cleveland and Toledo, Detroit, Milwaukee, Pittsburgh and Savannah.

2c Lake Placid
Stamps to honor the Olympic games have been issued by the nations where games were held for some years. In 1932 the games were held in the United States, the third Winter Olympics was also held here, and it was decided to issue the 2c Lake Placid stamp for the events.

Fifty-one million, one hundred and two thousand, and eight hundred 2c—Olympic Winter Games—flat plate, perforation 11, no watermark, were issued on January 25, 1932, from plates 20815 to 20826. It is recorded on carmine rose, with bright and deep shades, a small double transfer, a cracked plate, a "red snowball" variety and a number of smaller ones. The crack appears on the two upper panes of plate 20823, stamp 50 upper left and stamps 41, 42, 51 and 52 upper right, all show it. The red dot or snowball is found in front of the ski jumper on stamp 64, upper pane, plate 20815.

First day covers are from Lake Placid, N.Y., where the games were held dated Jan. 25, 1932, and the stamps were placed on sale at the Agency the following day.

Air Lines Inaugurate Business Circle Tours

Six special business circle tours from Chicago to the Pacific coast have been established by United Air Lines Traffic department and were announced today by Harold Crary, vice president in charge of traffic.

The circle tours are made possible because United's route leads directly to the Salt Lake City gateway where lines radiate northwesterly to Portland, Seattle and other Pacific Northwest cities, west to San Francisco and Oakland and southwest to Los Angeles and San Diego.

Crary pointed out that substantial time savings were effected by the new circle and optional routing itineraries because in no case is there the necessity of a double haul to serve Pacific coast cities. The circle tours range from one covering sixteen western cities including the entire Pacific coast between Seattle and Los Angeles, to one which includes every major Pacific Northwest point on its circle itinerary.

this month, with overnight and daylight flights between Chicago, Cleveland and New York.
