1936 License Plates Prove To Be Defective

Springfield, Ill., Jan. 18.—Alleging the C. H. Hanson company of Chicago with failure to carry out contract specifications in the manufacture of 1936 Illinois automobile license plates, Secretary of State Edward J. Hughes today declared that many of the plates had already begun to deteriorate and that he had notified the Fidelity and Casualty company of New York, who underwrote the Hanson bond, that the company had defaulted.

After conferring with Attorney General Kerner he notified the manufacturing concern of his intention to proceed against them unless the state's contract was carried out to the letter. Payments to the C. H. Hanson company are being held up and both the manufacturer and the bonding company have been notified of the situation.

Secretary Hughes said that officials of the Hanson company assure him that plates now being fabricated meet with all specification requirements. He stated that he will insist on the replacement of all defective plates at the manufacturers' expense.

All defective plates now in use will be replaced with no cost or inconvenience to the owners, Mr. Hughes said. A postal card directed to the office of the Secretary of State at Springfield will insure prompt delivery of duplicate tags, he stated.

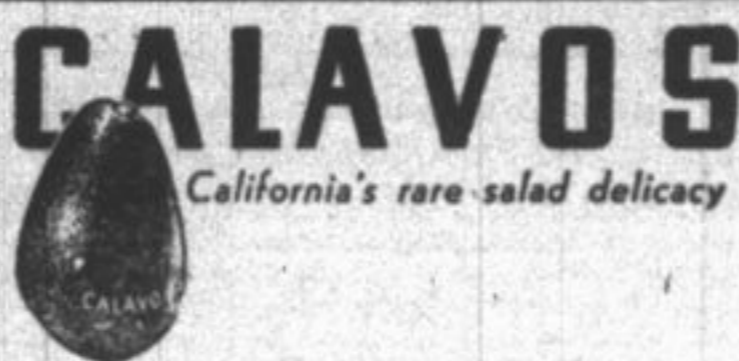
Red Cross To Hold Life Saving Course

Sponsored by the American Red Cross, a participating agency in the Highland Park Community Chest, a life saving examiners' review course will be held at the Shawnee Country club, Wilmette, Friday evenings, January 17, 24 and 31.

The course is restricted to North Shore residents who have previously held appointments as Red Cross life saving examiners.

Subjects to be covered include life saving technique in swimming and equipment rescues, teaching and examining methods, and latest developments in Red Cross life saving practices, standards and policies.

Sessions will extend from 7:30 to 10:30 o'clock, the first hour and a half being devoted to discussion and the balance to demonstration and practice. Full time attendance will be required for satisfactory completion of the course. There will be no charge for the course, although the club will charge a nominal fee of 25 cents for the use of pool and club facilities.

Last year when California's semi-tropical calavos arrive on the market for the first time in quantities so that prices automatically slid down the scale into the "average woman's" budget, women who like to venture into new culinary fields became "persuasion engineers" and served many salads, cocktails, and desserts which had never before appeared on family menus.

This year in those homes, an old friend is being welcomed, as calavos become seasonable again at reasonable prices. Most of us have served calavos in halves, with lemon juice or tart French dressing, the "half shell" of typical California service; and have used them sliced with contrasting tart fruits, or with vegetables such as tomatoes and onions.

The very newest vogue for serving calavos is as a canape or sandwich spread. For canapes the fruit must be soft enough to be put through a sieve or mashed with a fork; then seasoned to taste with salt, lemon juice, onion salt or juice, or finely chopped green onion or

chives and a dash of Worcestershire and Tabasco sauces. Serve generously in an appropriate bowl with one of the new and lovely cheese and cracker trays, decked out with a variety of crackers. Serve with contrasting accompaniment of olives—your favorite pickles, or radishes and celery. Add "what have you" to drink, for a successful easily prepared, and inexpensive buffet service.
