The 2c-Steamer Clermont, was issued on September 14, 1909, perforated 12 and watermarked double Ball Januray 30th lined USPS. It is recorded in Carmine, with bright and deep shades, with very scarce double transfers and a double impression, although the latter is not recognized by King and Johl in their book. 72,634,931 stamps were issued, from plates 5389, 5390, 5391, 5392, 5393, 5394

This stamp was also issued in imperforate sheets and is to be found with the Mail-O-Meter, Schermack and U. S. Vending Machine Co. perforations. It appeared on Sept. 24, 1909 and as all the plates used for the perforated stamps were again
