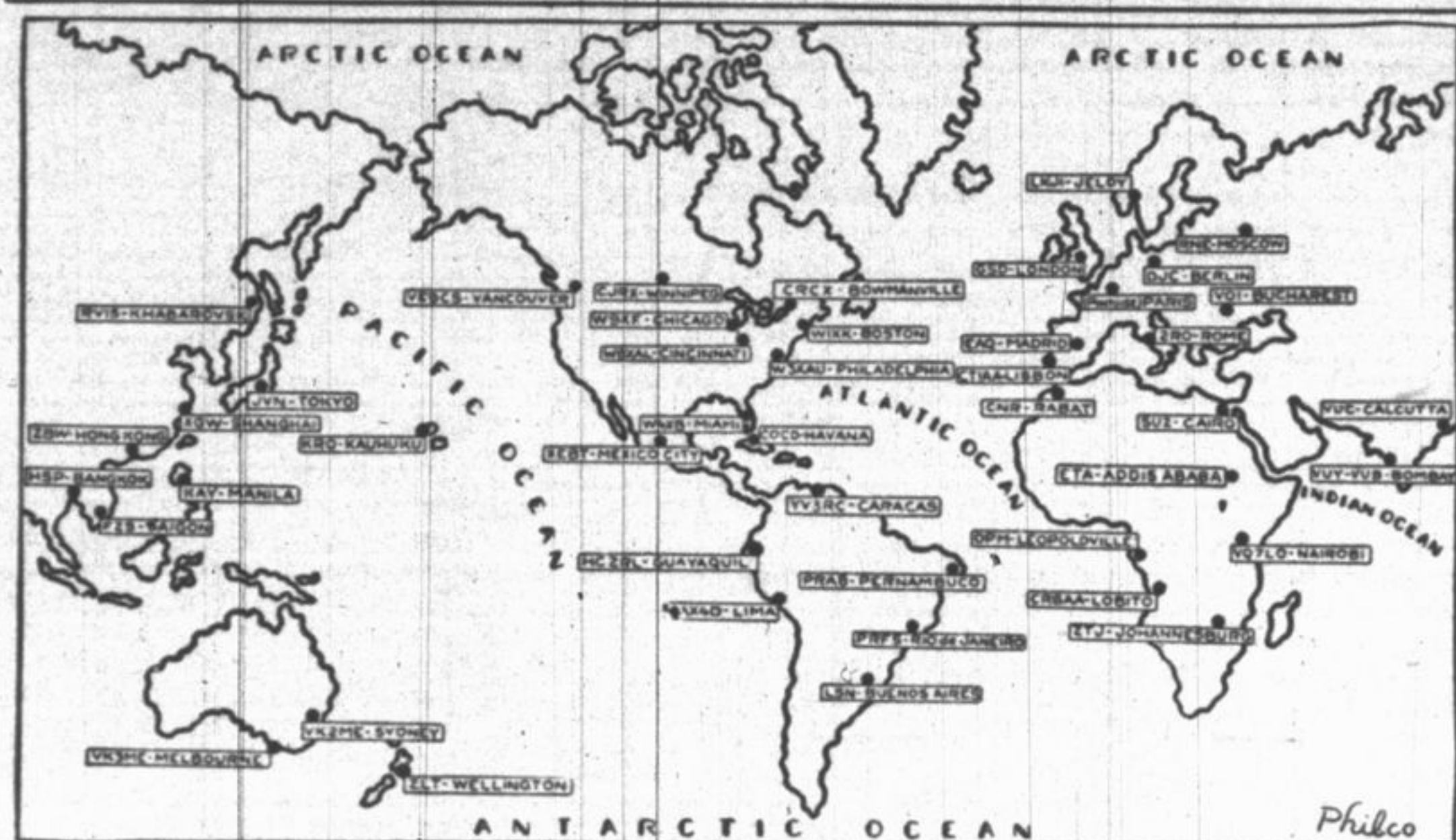


World Short-Wave Stations Increase



WITH England, France, Germany and Czechoslovakia now building powerful new short-wave stations, the number of European short-wave transmitters will be doubled by the end of the winter, according to officials of Philco Radio & Television Corporation. Within the past few weeks a number of new South American stations have also appeared. Not only is the number of short-wave stations being doubled but a new built-in aerial tuning system enables Philco listeners to get double the number of foreign stations possible before. Every day news bulletins in English are available from such powerful transmitters as GSD in London, EAQ in Madrid, and DJD in Berlin. Program schedules of these and other short-wave stations will be supplied without charge to those addressing The Radio Institute of the Audible Arts, 80 Broadway, New York City.

Stamp Facts

The Press is very grateful to Miss Lois Greene, who is in Changsha, China, for the following information about a new issue of stamps just put out in China. It is called "The New Life Movement Stamps" and is a 5 cent issue.

"The New Life Movement Stamp." The top sentence reads from right to left in the Chinese, but I shall write it as we ordinarily read. Chung hua min kueh io cheng. To cheng means postage. The other part literally is Middle brilliant or glorious peoples' country. The empire used to be the Middle Kingdom, hence the middle in the name for the Republic. The lower sentence reads Hsin sheng ho rin dung gi nen or, Recent New Life Movement Commemoration. Movement and Commemoration are each made up of two characters. They say Chinese is a mono-syllabic language, but they put two or more characters together, so that it sounds poly-syllabic.

The upper right hand character is Li for politeness or etiquette. It has a very broad meaning, taking in the respect for old traditions and family relations, etc. The lower right is I or Yi meaning the attitude one has toward friends, or really righteousness and faithfulness. The upper left is Lien, meaning incorrupt or scrupulous. It is the opposite of squeeze or grafting in politics.

The lower left is Ch'ih (tse), meaning disgrace or shame, intended to call to remembrance the disgraces China has suffered at the hands of other nations. These four characters are the watchwords of the New Life Movement and are taken from old Chinese ethics and given new meanings. The left hand white circle has a wu in it for five, and the right one a fen for 1/10 or cent. The star at the top is the emblem on the national flag, and the New Life emblem in the center is a compass.
