Mr. Eastman has now begun to take definite action. He has indicated that he plans to order the consolidation of terminals in 11 cities, which will mean the abandonment of passenger stations, freight yards and repair shops at the designated points. As soon as he has put these simpler consolidation plans into effect, the Federal Coordinator of Transportation has stated that he will deal with the more complicated ones in connection with such cities as New York, Chicago, St. Louis, and Kansas City.

Members of Congress who had previously placed the various reports of the Federal Coordinator of Transportation on their office book shelves are now dusting them off and carefully reading each page, with a view to determining just how far his consolidation proposals go. While Mr. Eastman has taken the position that public ownership of the railroads is not desired, he has stated that such ownership may be inevitable.

A few have already written me on the question of government ownership of railroads, and it can be anticipated that the Eastman railroad consolidation program will soon be a subject for lively discussion. The office automatically expires on June 16.






