From the novel by Dostoevsk, a brilliant young student of criminology, attracts much favorable comment by an anonymous brochure on crime. Debts and depleted funds bring him in contact with a grasping pawn broker, an elderly woman. Her sharp dealing with him and his sympathy for others who fall into her clutches, suggested to him her possible murder, which he accomplishes. Later his self-absorption and inner conflict draw the suspicion of the police inspector, who uses his knowledge of criminal reactions to involve him gradually but inevitably no confession of the crime. A starkly realistic psychological study, skillfully motivated and developed to a convincing conclusion. Adults.
