Wages War on T. B.

The Lake County Tuberculosis association, through its educational campaign each spring, strives to make the story of tuberculosis familiar to everyone.

Tuberculosis germs may be spread indirectly - thru spitting on walks and floors, through handling drinking cups, pencils, spoons and pipes, and through using milk from tuberculous cattle-and directly by means of intimate contact with another who has tuberculosis.

Once the tuberculosis germs enter the body they are surrounded by cells which enclose them like a net forming a capsule or shell. If these cells can envelope the tubercle bacillus faster than the disease germs can multiply, the infection will not spread but, instead, the tuberculosis germs will perish without doing

But the body must have its full fighting power if the infection is to be overcome. Tuberculosis germs infect the body at a time when resist-
