# CALAVOS

California's rare salad delicacy

Those special concessions to Lenten menu demands are not so hard to make when such appetite tempting salads as Lenten salad may be served.

Red salmon fits well into the needs of this combination, although crab meat, tuna, or lobster may be substituted at will.

The contrast of red salmon and green calavo is delightful in flavor as well as color. The combination may also be employed in mixed form with cubed calavos, flaked salmon, and sliced celery rounds lightly tossed with mayonnaise in desired proportions.

**Lenten Salad**  
2 calavos  
1 cup sliced celery  
1 cup flaked salmon  
Lemon juice  
3 tablespoons mayonnaise  
Salt

To prepare calavos, cut into halves lengthwise, remove seeds, and sprinkle cut portions with lemon juice and salt. Combine sliced celery, flaked salmon, few drops lemon juice, and mayonnaise, and mix lightly. Fill calavo centers with salmon mixture. Serve on lettuce-garnished salad plates. Serves 4.

## Lake County Ass'n Wages War on T. B.

The Lake County Tuberculosis association, through its educational campaign each spring, strives to make the story of tuberculosis familiar to everyone.

Tuberculosis germs may spread indirectly—thru spitting on walks and floors, through handling drinking cups, pencils, spoons and pipes, and through using milk from tuberculous cattle—and directly by means of intimate contact with another who has tuberculosis.

Once the tuberculosis germs enter the body they are surrounded by cells which enclose them like a net forming a capsule or shell. If these cells can envelope the tubercle bacillus faster than the disease germs can multiply, the infection will not spread but, instead, the tuberculosis germs will perish without doing harm.

But the body must have its full fighting power if the infection is to be overcome. Tuberculosis germs infect the body at a time when resist-

ance is lowered. The "teen age" of children is a time of danger because then they study too hard, use up energy playing competitive games, do not get sufficient rest and sleep and develop careless eating habits. That explains why tuberculosis causes the greatest number of deaths between the ages 15 and 45.

Only the tubercle bacillus can cause tuberculosis but hard times, overwork, strain, dissipation, discouragement and other burdens are great allies of the germ. Surroundings are very important—where, how and with whom one lives decided whether or not he is going to develop tuberculosis.
