100th BIRTHDAY CHICAGO FIRE MEMORIES



The thrilling night of the great Chicago fire—October 7th, 1871—was recalled yesterday at Hotel Sherman in Chicago when Ernest Byfield and Frank Bering presented a birthday cake, gleaming with 100 candles.

The elaborate festivities commemorating the centenary of Mrs. Blakeslee were a tribute on the part of Hotel Sherman to the aged woman for her neighborly services during the wild confusion that reigned when all Chicago was a horrible holocaust.

"It was the night of October 7, 1871," she mused. "My husband and I were walking along Randolph Street, when the great bell in the court house across the street from the Hotel Sherman began to clang its warning of fire.

"Suddenly, out of hundreds of windows of the hotel, burst the furious flames, fanned by a shift in the wind. Just then, Mr. Pierce, who was Manager of the hotel, ran out with valuable records and papers and entrusted them to me, because he and my husband were close friends.

"She stopped and chuckled. "Mr. Pierce always said I'd live to be an old woman, but I used to say he was joshing."

This debt of courtesy has been acknowledged each year by Hotel Sherman. This year, however, on "Aunt" Blakeslee's 100th birthday, a more elaborate affair was arranged with a magnificent birthday cake and eloquent tributes by both Ernest Byfield and Frank Bering.

During recent years "Aunt" Blakeslee has avoided the noise and bustle of the city, caring for her garden at her home on the peaceful shores of Crystal Lake, a resort miles from Chicago.

Fell's Clothiers Defeat Winnetka Panthers 35-23

Fell's Clothiers decisively defeated the Winnetka Panthers Monday night when they fought their way to a brilliant 35 to 23 victory at the Winnetka Community House before a large partisan crowd.

Pasquesi Gets 14 Points Diminutive Cesare Pasquesi led the Fell attack with fourteen points scored on six field goals and two free throws.

The superior passing and fast breaking attack of the Highland Park team pulled the game out of the fire after the Panthers grabbed a 13 to 11 lead in the first half

and threatened to overtake the Clothiers in the last period. The outstanding play of the game was Tommy Russell's basket (his first in twelve games). It was made right outside the free throw line on a clean shot that did not touch the rim.

Dean, Rogan Score Warren Dean and Bill Rogan kept up their good offensive work. Dean got four baskets for eight points while Rogan got four baskets and a free throw for nine points.
