100th BIRTHDAY CHICAGO FIRE MEMORIES



The thrilling night of the great Chicago Fire-October 7th, 1871was recalled yesterday at Hotel Sherman in Chicago when Ernest Byfield and Frank Bering presented a birthday cake, gleaming with 100 candles, to Mrs. Aurelia Blakeslee of Crystal Lake, Illinois, who had just reached the century mark.

The elaborate festivities commemorating the centenary of Mrs. Blakeslee were a tribute on the part of Hotel Sherman to the aged woman for her neighborly services during the wild confusion that reigned when all Chicago was a horrible holocaust. Let Mrs. Blakeslee, who was then a buxom matron of 35, tell the story.

"It was the night of October ? 1871," she mused. "My husband and I were walking along Randolph Street, when the great bell in the court house across the street from the Hotel Sherman began to clang its warning of fire.

"Suddenly, out of hundreds of windows of the hotel, burst the furious flames, fanned by a shift in the wind. Just then, Mr. Pierce, who was Manager of the hotel, ran out with valuable records and papers and intrusted them to me, because he and my husband were close friends."

She stopped and chuckled. "Mr. Pierce always said I'd live to be an old woman, but I used to say he was

This debt of courtesy has been acknowledged each year by Hotel Sherman. This year, however, on "Aunty" Blakeslee's 100th birthday, a more elaborate affair was arranged with a magnificent birthday cake and eloquent tributes by both Ernest Byfield and Frank Bering.


