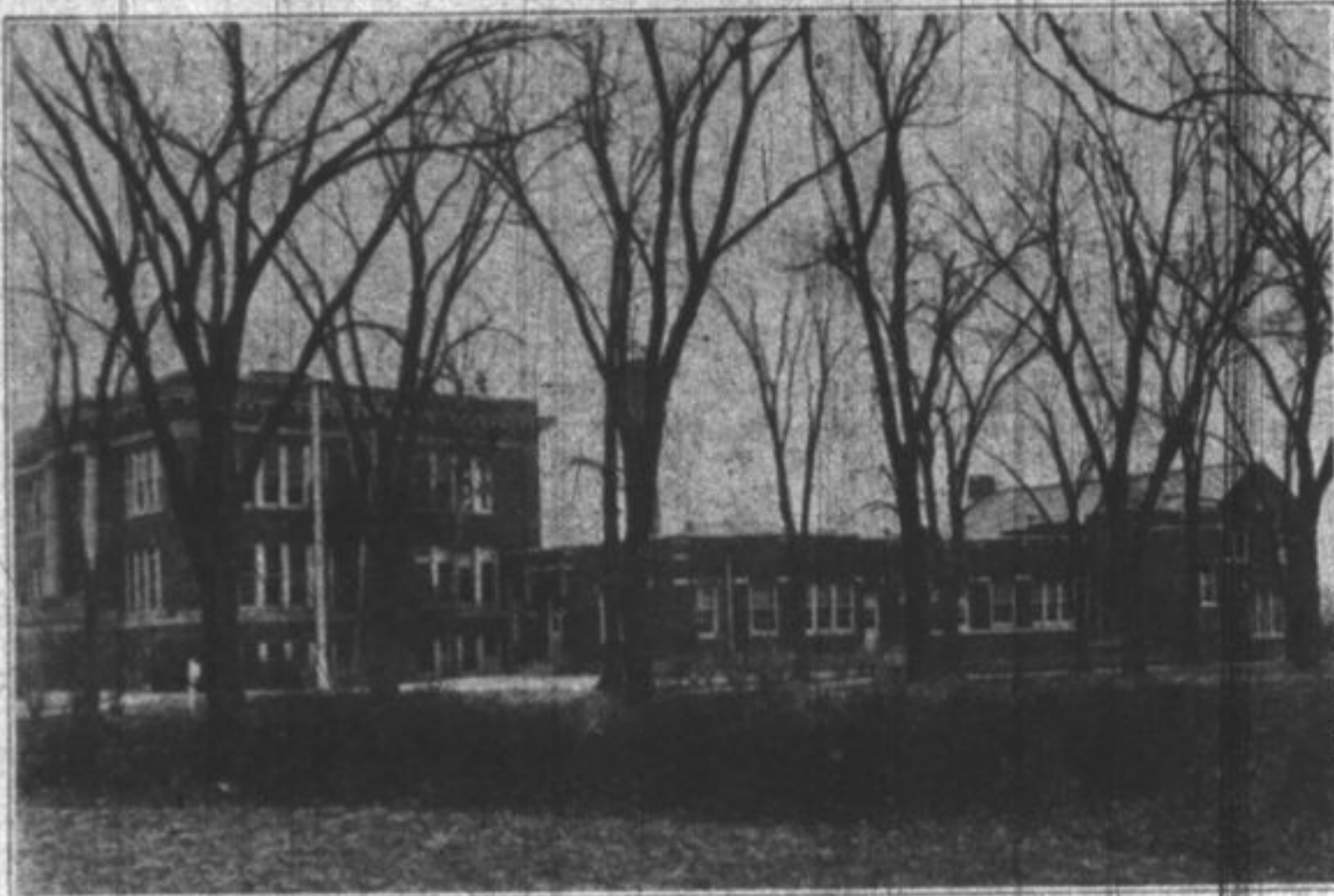


THE ELM PLACE SCHOOL

FIRE CAUSES MUCH EXCITEMENT

August 8, 1912

Much good kindling was consumed and considerable excitement raised by a fire which destroyed a small shed in the rear of the Press office Monday. The fire started presumably from a scrap of burning paper blown from a steel cage in which the paper scraps were burned and was extinguished in a few moments by the fire department.

NEW FOUNTAIN IS IN PLACE
