St. Patrick's Day Supper Menu: Buttered green asparagus, Tuna Fish Loaf, Endive and watercress salad, Shamrock rolls, Pineapple sherbet, Green Tea

TUNA FISH LOAF: To one can of flaked tuna, add 2 teas. of lemon juice, a few drops of tobacco sauce, salt to taste and 1/2 cup of stiffly beaten cream...

ENDIVE AND WATER CRESS SALAD: With your scissors, cut watercress and white curled endive up into small pieces. Put into salad bowl, pour over the greens some olive or salad oil, and squeeze lemon juice over all...

SHRIMPS EN CASSEROLE: 1 can shrimp, 1 can green asparagus, Bread crumbs, 3 hard boiled eggs, White sauce, seasoned

sired. Cover with buttered bread crumbs and place in hot oven 400 degrees F., for 20 minutes.

CORN FRITTERS with Maple-Rum Syrup: 2 cups flour, 1/2 teas. salt, 2 eggs, 1 1/2 cups corn, 3 teas. baking powder, 1 tbslp. sugar, 1 1/2 cups milk. Mix ingredients and beat two minutes. Drop tablespoonful into hot deep fat and cook until well browned on all sides.

CREAMED CRABS WITH MUSHROOMS: 1 quart flaked crab meat, 1/2 oz. can sliced mushrooms, Grated cheese, 2 eggs, 1 cup cream sauce, Salt and paprika. Beat the eggs and stir into the crabmeat; add the mushrooms and the cream sauce, which should be well seasoned. Place in a baking dish, sprinkle with grated cheese and buttered bread crumbs. Bake for 25 minutes in moderate oven 350 degrees F.

"Freshman Love." Cast: Frank McHugh, Patricia Ellis, George E. Stone, March 12, Thursday. A rollicking, farcical story of "Freshman in Love" and "Row-for-Good-Old-Billings." The pretty daughter of Prexy Simpkins recruits a crew by resorting to flirtatious wiles. The oarsmen, dependent upon rhythm, set a winning pace in response to the urge of a jazz-playing coxswain.

"Charlie Chan's Secret." Cast: Warner Oland, Rosina Lawrence, Henrietta Crossman, Herbert Mundin; Friday, Saturday, March 13-14. The speed with which Charlie Chan pictures are produced makes one wonder that they are so consistently good. Warner Oland is the perfect detective who solves a mysterious murder when an old family, interested in things psychic, loses one of its members during a seance. A well sustained murder mystery. The plot is a good one and the cast capable while the direction achieves suspense and a sinister atmosphere. Family, too frightening for small children.

"Navy Wife." Cast: Claire Trevor, Ralph Bellamy, Ben Lyon; March 15, 16, Sunday, Monday. This adaptation of Kathleen Norris' novel "Beauty's Daughter," will not find favor with those who enjoyed the book. The marriage of a young naval doctor and nurse, based upon respect and understanding rather than love, has a most unconvincing and illogical ending. However, clever dialogue, interesting scenes in a navy base hospital and vigorous comedy of sailors on "Shore Leave" contribute much to the entertainment value of the picture.

"Last of the Pagans." Cast: Mala-Lotus and natives, March 19, 20, Tuesday, Wednesday. This interesting and vivid picture has for its setting a Polynesian island, depicting its inhabitants, its dress, customs and native emotions. The

story is well told, with unique dialogue in native tongue. The scenery is beautiful and well photographed. The swimming and natural grace of the natives is shown. Excellent entertainment. Family.
