

## The History of the Dog

According to the Zoological classification, dogs are members of the order Carnivora, which, along with fifteen other orders, belongs to a class of animals which feed their young by mammary glands, the Mammalia. Dogs, wolves, jackals, foxes, etc., are members of this family Canidae, which name always precedes the species name in scientific terminology.

Whether the common, domesticated dog, taking all species as one, developed from a single wild stock, or whether they descended from a number of species is at best a matter of a great deal of conjecture. It is a matter that has never been satisfactorily settled. It is quite possible that in pre-historic times there existed one species of dog that

varied only in minor details according to the location on the earth in which it lived, for, with the exception of a few of the Eastern breeds of the present day Canidae, wild and domesticated dogs alike bear a great deal of resemblance to each other. Internally, the skeletons are alike, while externally, their tails are all fairly long, and they are equipped with digitigrade feet on which are blunt, non-retractable, nearly straight claws. Dogs walk on their toes, since they are digitigrade, while the domesticated dog stands even more perpendicular than does the wolf.

The remains of animals from pre-historic times are not very encouraging as far as tracing the development of the modern dog is concerned.

Variations in size between the different breeds are not very difficult to understand, though the extreme contrasts between the very small toy dogs and the huge great dogs or the mastiffs does seem strange. The only way in which this might be explained is that the contrast might have been brought about by a gradual change in size over a period of centuries.

According to all the available records twenty-nine species of wild dogs or their remains have been discovered and described. They are all similar in appearance, varying with their environment, and include the Siberian wild dog, which inhabits Northern Asia, particularly the more wooded portions; the Indian wild dog, or Southern Dhole, found in the forest of the Himalayas; the Malay wild dog; the Asara's dog, which is found in Brazil and is quite easily tamed; the crab eating dog, also found in South America; and the Colpo, which lives between Tierra del Fuego and Chile.

The Short Eared Dog (*Canis microtis*) is only known through one specimen which is preserved in the British Museum, while the Raccoon Dog of China, Japan, and Amoor-

land is quite numerous in those countries. The Hoary Aguara Dog has been domesticated on several occasions by the Indians, while the Falkland Island Aguara Dog lives in burrows along the sea downs, feeding chiefly upon birds. The Aguara Dog of the Woods is some thing similar to the Falkland Island Aguara Dog.

In Egypt there was formerly a dog known as *Canis anthus*, a rather large dog, of massive appearance, while further towards the south there is the Cape Hunting Dog, which assimilates the greyhound type a great deal. A North American Dog is found in the northern part of Canada, while in Europe is the Teichichi, a long-bodied, heavy dog, with large head and short legs. The Hare Indian Dog was found only with tribes of Indians living along the borders of Great Bear Lake and the banks of the Mackenzie, and was the wild counterpart of the modern Collie. The Nicobar Island Dog, appearing as the pariah dog of India, feeds almost exclusively on coconuts, while the Poe Dog, discovered at first in Tahiti, feeds for the most part on breadfruit. The Carrier

Dog was used by the Carrier Indians of New Caledonia, and the dogs of New Zealand are eaten by the natives and their skins used to make clothing. A South Sea Island Dog had a large head and small eyes, with pointed ears and tufted tails, while the Aboriginal Dog of Patagonia was about the size of a large foxhound.

In addition to the above mentioned species, there are also the Egyptian Indian Dog, the Dogs of Hindustan, the Feral dogs of Russia, Turkey, Natolia and San Domingo.
