

Edward A. Warren Is Candidate For State Legislature



Edward A. Warren, a life long resident of Highland Park, and prominent in North Shore architectural and construction circles, has announced his candidacy as Representative for the Eighth Senatorial district at the Primary elections on April 14.

Mr. Warren has taken an active part in civic affairs here, having served for 16 years as city clerk, 12 years as alderman, under the aldermanic form of city government, and for 3 years as a member of the Elm Place school board. He has been the designer and builder of many beautiful homes and buildings on the North Shore, one of the most outstanding examples of his work being the Moraine hotel. He has always been active in Republican state and national affairs. He served as a Presidential Elector in 1904 when Theodore Roosevelt was elected. Mr. Warren is a firm believer in just taxation and the careful handling and disbursement of public funds.

New Lubricator Is Offered To Motorists

Incredible as it may seem, a revolutionary method of producing a new form of graphite has been discovered. This product is known as colloidal graphite. It is created by a patented process in an electric furnace at a temperature of 7,500 degrees F. This graphite is grit-free and so fine that particles of it can be seen by the human eye only with the aid of a powerful microscope. The particles are so small that 400 of them are required to encircle the finest drawn tungsten wire measuring .0003 of an inch in thickness. These minute elements will pass through the finest of filters, even those as fine as chaamois skin. This special process colloidal graphite is so light that it will actually float in the air, like smoke, we are told. It will blend, permanently with mineral oil, will remain in suspension, and will not settle out of the oil into which it has been injected.

Oil charged with graphite is sold

for and recommended as a top cylinder lubricator to be fed through the intake manifold by a lubricator. A special lubricator is not required. It is said to have a very high resistance to oxidation which is certainly in its favor as a top cylinder lubricant. It is not soluble so the gasoline would have no particular effect on it.

In running in new or rebuilt engines colloidal graphite has probably been more widely used than at any other time. At a time when the tool marks and the roughness of the metallic surfaces exceed the thickness of the oil film, the graphite fills in the pores and imparts to the surface the polish required for normal performance.

The automotive industry in European countries has taken more readily to the use of colloidal graphite and apparently more of it is used in Europe than in this country. It is a subject of active interest and all of the discussion between authorities seems to be in favor of its use.

PUBLIC NOTICE

Proposed Sewer Outfall and Shore Protection, Lake Michigan, Highland Park, Ill.

When an application is received for a War Department permit to authorize proposed work in or over a navigable water of the United States, the department regulations state that notices regarding the matter shall be sent to all persons deemed likely to be interested, in order that any protests from the standpoint of navigation may be received.

This notice is to inform interested persons that the North Shore Sanitary district, Waukegan, Ill., acting through Mr. John Oliver, president, has made applications for a permit to construct a sewer outfall and shore protection in Lake Michigan at Ravinia drive, Highland Park.

The plans show the proposed sewer outfall to consist of a 12-inch cast iron pipe, supported by steel piles on 6-foot centers, extending a maximum distance of about 180 feet lakeward from the normal shore

line. The tops of the steel piles will be about 2 1/2 feet above the water surface, with the exception of the last two pairs of piles which will be about 5 1/2 feet above the water surface. The proposed shore protection consists of about 400 feet of steel sheeting located 25 feet or more landward of the normal shore line, stiffened with buttresses about 13 feet apart. The plan of the proposed work may be seen at the office of the undersigned and will be mailed to interested persons upon request.

Any objection to the proposed work from the standpoint of navigation should be mailed to the undersigned within ten days from the date of this notice.
