

# The History of the Dog

### The Esquimaux Dog and Its Relatives

The Esquimaux Dog and the Samoyed are very closely related, the former being of various colors, while the latter is not only a much smaller dog, but is also only bred in the pure white color at the present time. In England, where these dogs are produced more, some are tinged slightly with brown, and even black head markings are sometimes found. The Samoyed of modern times stands approximately 20 inches high at the shoulder, and weighs probably about 30 to 40 pounds. This is somewhat larger than the dog that was first imported.

The Esquimaux Dog is not as pretty or as handsome as the Samoyed, being more wolf-like in appearance, with an exceedingly long face and muzzle. The colors of this dog are very characteristic, black and greyish brown, with the black holding the predominance and preference. However, some are pure white and can only be differentiated from the Samoyed by length of leg and face. One peculiar characteristic of the Esquimaux is that mating between the "king," or leader of a pack, or the lead dog of a sledge team, and a bitch is binding and permanent, protected by the "king" with the greatest of canine ferocity. This is not true of other breeds or of other individuals within the Esquimaux breed.

In old diaries can be found a wealth of excellent descriptions of the Esquimaux and the Samoyed at work, in teams, dragging huge sleds over icy ground, led by the "king," and driven by a person who must have had a knowledge of the language of the dogs, almost an artist at his occupation.

The relationship between these dogs and wolves is very interesting. Of course nothing very definite can

be stated as to the exact Esquimaux and Samoyed ancestry, but it is known that they have an instinctive longing for fat and blubber, and Arctic explorers frequently report that their Esquimaux bitches stray away from their headquarters and bases, only to return pregnant to wolves. Also, these wolves have been known to entice the domesticated dogs away from their huts, and it is an established fact that Esquimaux dogs, when suffering from extreme hunger and starvation will not drink water unless it is oily.

The Esquimaux was first allied to a class at a dog show in 1888. This took place at the Kennel Club Show at the Agricultural Hall in London. At the present time, the following are the points considered characteristic of the breed: head powerful, wedge-shaped; skull broad and flat, lips black; eyes wide set; jaws strong and level; chest broad; feet long and flat; tail long and profuse, carries over the back; coat close and thick, outer coat harsh, free from curls.

The Pomeranian is very closely related to the Esquimaux and the Samoyed. The earliest record of the name "Pomeranian" is in the writings of George Vancouver, in his "Voyage of Discovery Around the World," who reported that he visited an Indian village and found there a number of dogs resembling those of Pomerania, though they were somewhat larger. The Pomeranian was more popular on the European continent for many years than it was in England where very few were kept. In 1875 there were only eight entries in the Kennel Club Stud Book, and it is said that the history of the breed began in 1891 when the Pomeranian Club was formed. This stimulated a great deal of interest in the breed and it was not long before show-

Show points today cover the following: Head wedge-shaped; back short; body compact; feet small; nose black; coat short and smooth; all whole colors, free from black or white shadings; weights, the smaller the better, even down to as low as three and one-half pounds.

The Elkhound, a member of the Spitz family, known in Norway and Sweden as Norrlandsk Spets, Grahund, amthund, and den Graa Dyrehund, and the Keeshond, a well-known Dutch dog, are also related to the Esquimaux and the Samoyed.

### Hylton Concludes Program Series for Standard Oil

Jack Hylton will lead his band and Continental Revue in the last of a series of twenty-six radio programs Saturday night, April 4, when he concludes his engagement for the Standard Oil Company of Indiana on a Midwest network of the Columbia Broadcasting System.

Coming to this country for the first time at the behest of the sponsor of the program, Hylton, who for many years has been an outstanding band leader abroad, is credited with introducing a new tempo in American musical entertainment and popularizing, through his comic raucous, Pat O'Malley, many humorous monologues of British origin.

More than 20000 people attended Hylton's visual broadcasts in Chicago and Detroit, and his music was heard by the radio audience which tuned in on nineteen stations in as many cities from Lake Erie to the Rocky Mountains.

In addition to bringing Magna Need, an Australian prima donna, and Peggy Dell, noted Irish singer from Dublin Hylton introduced in America the now famous Alec Templeton big band musical genius, who packed Chicago's Orchestra Hall to overflowing at his first American recital. With the troupe, too, came Effie Atherton, English singing comedienne and Clive Erard, humorous vocalist from London, both of whom are rapidly rising to stardom in this country.

### Public Service Program To Feature Noble Cain

Noble Cain and his famous Chicago A Cappella choir of forty voices will make a guest appearance on the Public Service company's Mardi Gras program over WGN Wednesday, April 8, from 9:30 to 10 p.m., Chicago time (EST). Included in the regular parade of Mardi Gras stars who will be heard on the program are Dudley Crafts Watson, Harold Stokes and his orchestra, Bob Hannon, the Doring Sisters, and the Grenadiers male quartet.

A recognized authority on choral music, Noble Cain first attracted wide attention when he organized the world's largest high school chorus of 600 voices at Senn high school in Chicago. Later he directed a chorus of 6,000 in the Chicago and Music festival, and became the first director to assemble huge massed choruses to sing great choral works without previous rehearsal together. The A Cappella choir which will be heard on the Mardi Gras program brought Mr. Cain nationwide fame, and his book, "Choral Music," is now accepted as a standard text in many high schools and colleges throughout the country.

Despite his extensive work with choruses, Mr. Cain calls himself a poor singer; says his voice never was much good except for a few years when as a youngster he was boy soprano in the church choir in his hometown, Aurora, Indiana. His extensive musical training was mainly in piano.
