

This Week in Washington

Washington, D. C., April 4—On the whole this session of Congress which opened in January has been rather colorless.

Moreover, there are comparatively few members attending the daily sessions. On the average there have not been more than 20 out of 435 representatives in their seats during the discussions this week.

The committee meetings are poorly attended. At the last meeting of the Committee on Patents, now considering the Duffy Copyright Bill, only 4 of us out of a membership of 20 were present.

In the choice between returning to their respective districts to further their personal political ambitions or remaining in Washington to protect the interests of their districts, most of the members seem to feel that the mending and building of "political fences" is the more important.

At this writing the War Department Appropriation Bill is pending in conference, and the report of the conference committee can be expected almost any day.

Our district also has a special as well as a general interest in the Navy Department Appropriation Bill, which should be reported out of committee this coming week.
