## Charles E. Mason Ends Campaign for Reelection

Basing his campaign for reelection entirely on his record, State Attorney Charles E. Mason today concluded his peaking campaign.

In his swing through the county he stressed the fact that he had reduced the expense of office 98 per cent and increased the efficiency.

"I did not, at any time, abuse police powers and meddle and carried out all of my pledges made four years ago," Mr. Mason said at one time.

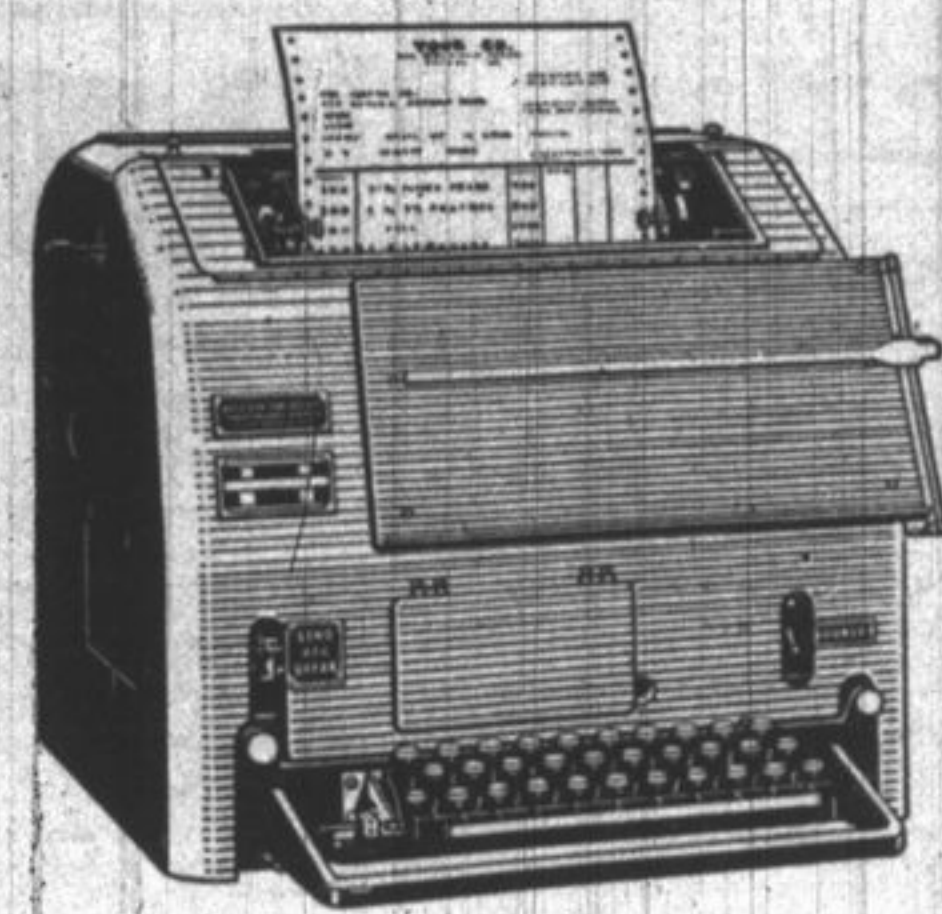
"While a total of 815 men and women were sent to prison and jails, I am not proud of that fact, but I am proud that of 191 I recommended for probation and sent back to society 168 made good and only 23 failed.

"It is with greater pride that I

can point to the fact that 1,528 children with their problems were brought before me and taken into the county court with their problems being settled so that they could be restored to their homes. Of that number it was necessary to send 17 to state training schools," Mr. Mason declared.

"I have kept within the strict letter of the law, and each day remembered my oath in office," he said.
