

### County Firemen to Hold Spring Meeting Next Monday at Antioch

Officials of the Lake County Firemen's association are completing arrangements to entertain more than 300 firemen at Antioch Monday, April 27, at 8 p.m. at the opening spring meeting of the association.

Those working on plans for the event are Chief Robert Burleigh, Assistant Chief William Walk and Honorary Chief Charles Burger of the Fox Lake fire department and Chief James Stearns, Captain Robert Wilton and Electrician William Anderson of the Antioch volunteer fire department.

The Antioch fire department has not had a county meeting of the fire-

men's association since the spring of 1933. It was decided when the date was set for the spring meeting that the Fox Lake department be named to assist with program plans and that members of the McHenry County Firemen's association be extended invitations to attend the session.

Many details of business are to be talked over between members of the two county associations, preparatory to holding the annual meetings of the two associations in May, when the annual election of officers will be held. The Lake county convention this year will be held in North Chicago on Wednesday, April 23.

A committee of secretaries from the various departments of Lake county, with a committee from the North Chicago Chamber of Commerce, is working out plans for the annual county convention.

This committee includes Chief Frank Freeman, Sylvan Slepman, Moe Redding and John Moore. It is expected that the annual county convention will draw a crowd of more than 500.

### Charles Ruben's \$202,000 Estate Left to Family

The estate of Charles Rubens, retired manufacturer and philanthropist, was admitted to probate Tuesday by Judge Martin C. Decker of the Lake county Probate court at Waukegan. It listed assets of \$202,500, mostly personal property.

Mr. Rubens, who was 71 years old, was killed April 1 in an automobile accident in Los Angeles. He lived at 257 Moraine road, Highland Park.

His widow, Mrs. Pauline Meyer Rubens, was named executrix of the estate. A provision explained Mr. Rubens did not provide for his wife in the will because she has her own estate. He left \$10,000 to the Jewish Charities, of which he was a former president. The remainder of the estate is divided equally among two daughters, Mrs. Katherine R. Loewenthal, Mrs. Margaret Well, and a son Walter L., all of Highland Park.

### Boat and Sports Show Opens May 3 in Chicago

An annual event which always attracts much interest in the suburban towns and Chicago communities, the Chicago National Boat and Sports Show, is scheduled for Navy Pier, May 3 to 10, inclusive. According to Hubbard (Hub) Erickson, manager of the famous outdoor and maritime exposition since its beginning seven years ago, the show has added many attractions and new features scheduled this spring indicate the record breaking attendance of 146,000 in 1935 is certain to be surpassed.

The big sports show, with its "seven ring circus" of competition in such events as bait and fly casting, horse shoe pitching, archery, rifle and pistol shooting, stationary bicycle "racing" and other events, always attracts camping, fishing and hunting enthusiasts, male and female, from all Chicagoland communities and is the sort of event that all members of the family like.

Bait and fly casting contests, sponsored by the Chicago Tribune, rifle and pistol shooting, sponsored by the Daily News, archery contests, sponsored by the Herald and Examiner, and the Daily Times, stationary bicycle racing contest, will all interest participants and spectators as well. Such suburban communities as Berwyn, for instance, always furnish leaders in the bait casting contests, and "crack shots" from Oak Park, Chicago Heights and Highland Park are among the entries in the shooting competition.

For the first time, the state of Illinois will officially join in the Chicago Boat and Sports Show. Manager Erickson points out, C. F. Thompson, state director of conservation, announces from Springfield that our state has an interesting out-of-door exhibit under construction. Exhibits from such famous woodland states as Minnesota and Wisconsin, will, as usual, bring a real touch of nature to the mile long Navy Pier.

All the latest in fishing tackle, hunting gear, and camp equipment such as tents and auto trailers, will be seen at the big show.

This year the boats, both sail and motor, will be seen in greater profusion than ever before. Nearly all the builders of water-going craft, especially of boats used on the Great Lakes and rivers, will show their very latest designs and models.

The big show, during its eight day run, which includes two Sundays, will have a great variety of entertainment features, including Indian singers and animal imitators, lumberjacks, radio stars and other attractions. The show will be opened from 1 p. m. to 11 p. m. each day.

Navy Pier has been completely rejuvenated, including the installation of a new heating system for use in chilly weather, and the decorations for the big show are particularly attractive to the sportsman.

Special days will include Illinois day, Wisconsin day, Izaak Walton day, Minnesota day, Yachtsmen day, aviation evening, baseball stars evening, etc.
