Household Hints

Ann Harding suggests a new way to bake apples. Peel the top half of the apple and bake in the usual way until they are soft but firm. Add a spoonful of sugar to each apple, place them under a broiler and brown quickly, basting once or twice.

Toast, carefully made and cut into strips, piled log cabin fashion on a pretty plate, proves to be more tempting than ordinary slices of the child with a finicky appetite.

Cleaning the milk bottle. Don't forget that microbes are apt to lurk about the mouth of the milk bottle. It should be carefully wiped off before the milk is poured out.

Boiling salad dressing. Many housewives fail with boiled salad dressing because they add the eggs to hot vinegar. If beaten eggs are thoroughly stirred into cold vinegar, and the mixture is then boiled, the dressing will not curdle.

Save and dry the celery tops, put into glass jars, and use to flavor stew with when celery is scarce.

To decorate cakes for children, frost them, then dip a small brush into melted chocolate or beaten egg yolk and put on design or name as desired. Any color may be used by adding fruit coloring to confectioner's sugar mixed with a bit of milk or water.

Boiling the molasses to be used in cookies or cake makes them taste richer and cut more smooth.

Serve mashed potatoes piled lightly into the hot potato dish. If smoothed and patted down it makes it soppy.
