AN ORDINANCE
TO AMEND PARAGRAPH 9% OF SECTION 248 AS AMENDED BY ARTICLE 12 OF THE HIGHLAND PARK CODE OF 1919 RELATIVE TO THE RULES GOVERNING THE USE OF CITY WATER, WATER METERS AND WATER REENTS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

That Paragraph 9% of Section 248 as amended, of Article 12 of the City Code of 1919 relative to the rules governing the use of city water, water meters and water rents be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

248. 9%. No applicant for use of water from the city water mains shall be granted or given such water service until a cash deposit shall be made by the applicant at the time of making the application and thereafter maintain at all times the security and prompt payment of all water used and until the use of such water is discontinued, pursuant to the Ordinance of the City of Highland Park, as follows:

For a dwelling of six rooms or less a deposit of Ten Dollars shall be made.

For a dwelling of not less than six rooms and more than eight rooms, a deposit of Twenty-Five Dollars shall be made.

For a dwelling over eight rooms, a deposit of Fifty Dollars shall be made.

For a meat market, restaurant, laundry, hotel, golf course, manufactory, and for any other business a deposit of an amount equal to one and one-half times the amount of the largest meter reading for water used for any one period during the past two years shall be made; provided, however, where a water service or premises has not formerly been used for the same purpose for which application is being made, then the amount of deposit shall be fixed by the Commissioner of Accounts and Finance, subject however to revision or adjustment after a period of two years so as to conform to the provisions of this ordinance. And provided further that no interest shall be allowed or paid upon any such deposit by the City of Highland Park.

Provided that any such deposit may be applied in payment or upon account of any water bill in default at any time at the election or discretion of the City Collector, and provided further, that if the amount of any such deposit shall be lessened by reason of the application of said deposit or any part thereof in payment or reduction of any water bill, the balance of said deposit of the respective full amount required by this ordinance shall be replaced within five days after service in writing or notice therefor, the water service to any such premises shall be terminated and meter removed.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and recording.
