"Everlasting Punishment" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, May 3.

The Golden Text was, "There is no peace, saith the Lord, unto the wicked" (Isaiah 48:22). Among the citations which comprised the Lesson-Sermon was the following from the Bible: "Righteousness keepeth him that is upright in the way; but wickedness overthroweth the sinner. . . Good understanding giveth favour; but the way of transgressors is hard" (Prov. 13:6, 15).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following passages from the Christian Science Textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "Fear of punishment never made man truly honest. . . Reason is the most active human faculty. Let that inform the sentiments and awaken the man's dormant sense of moral obligation, and by degrees he will learn the nothingness of the pleasures of human sense and the grandeur and bliss of a spiritual sense, which silences the material or corporeal. Then he not only will be saved, but is saved" (p. 327-328).

Golden Plovers Seen in Deerfield District

Mrs. George Engstrom of Deerfield, who has made a special study of bird life for the past decade, records her migration findings each year for the Government Survey at Washington, D. C. Last Monday, Mrs. Engstrom and a group of women, who have organized a bird club, were about three miles west of Deerfield near the Des Plaines river, where they saw a flock of sixty golden plovers. This is a most unusual occurrence for this locality and no reports are found in this region of their migration. These birds usually cross the continent much farther west on their trip north into Canada and Alaska for their summer nesting and they migrate in the fall to South America via the Pacific coast.
