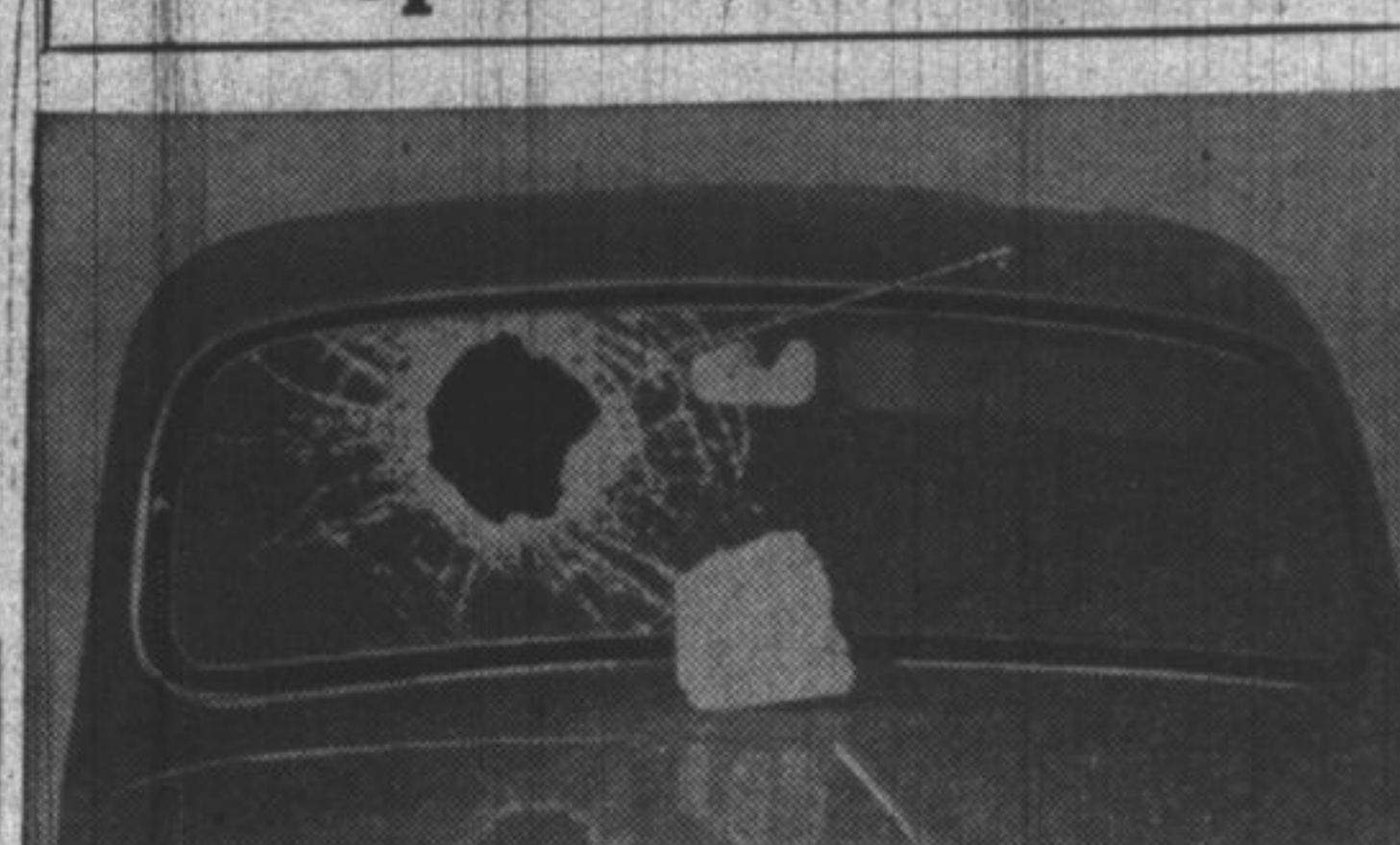
Highland Park Citizens Safety Committee Holds Meeting, Monday, May 18

The committee chairmen of the Highland Park Citizens' Safety committee met at the Library auditorium on Monday evening, May 18.

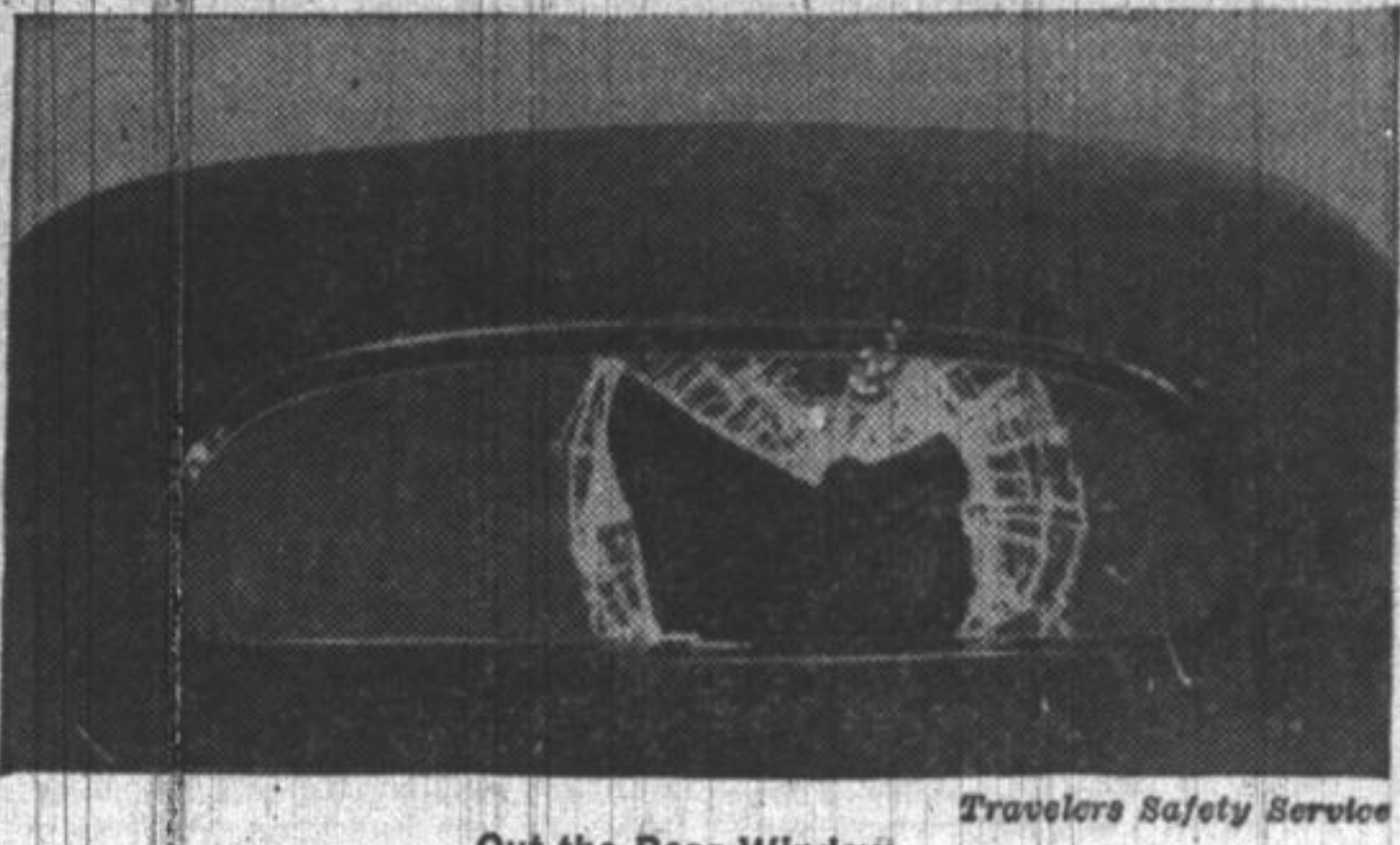

Excessive speed on the highway doesn't always manifest itself in the usual type of smash-up—the mass of crumpled steel and splintered wood that one sees so often pictured in the newspapers.

The stone shown in the top photograph weighs more than seven pounds and was thrown by a passing car. To lift it up to windshield height the machine which threw it must have been moving at a high rate of speed.

which it passed must also have been moving rapidly, for the missile pierced the non-shatterable glass windshield, killed a passenger in the front seat and knocked an occupant of the rear seat unconscious, and then continued on its way through the non-shatterable rear window.

To puncture such glass, even with a seven-pound stone, it takes force akin to that generated by tornadoes, which have been known to drive straws deep into trees. It takes speed.
