**Salads...** how many times in hotels, restaurants and tea rooms have you admired them and wished you could go home and make some like them. Here are several, taken from a Chef's own recipe book...

**Shrimp and Pineapple Salad**  
Remove the black line from 1 1/2 cups shrimp, and cut into pieces. Mix well with 1/2 cup of French dressing and marinate for one-half hour. Drain the shrimp and mix with 1 1/2 cups of pineapple tid-bits (drained), 1/2 teas. salt, 1/4 teas. paprika, blend well and serve in salad bowl which has been lined with crisp cold lettuce. Top with mayonnaise or serve separate. Garnish with olives, cut in two.

**Amsterdam Salad**  
(Serves 1)  
Put one slice of pineapple on crisp cold lettuce leaves. Make a ball of 1/2 oz. of cream cheese and put 1 maraschino cherry in its center. Place cheese ball on center of pineapple, sprinkle with chopped nuts. Serve any desired dressing separately.

**Bombay Salad**  
Break open a fresh coconut and grate the meat. Mix a cup of the meat with 2 cups cooked diced chicken, a half cup of cooked rice, some India relish and one quarter cup of French dressing. Pile in a lettuce lined bowl, arrange wide strips of pickles around edge of salad. Sprinkle top of salad with grated coconut. You'll find this very colorful and highly tasty.

**Beet and Celery Salad**  
Cut 4 cooked beets and 4 or 5 stalks of celery in small cubes. Chop 1 white onion fine. Marinate all vegetables in French dressing about one hour. Serve on curled endive or lettuce, which is crisp and cold.

**Cabbage and Pineapple Slaw**  
Press 2 cups of finely chopped cabbage down in a measuring cup and when filled put in salad bowl, add 1/2 cup of drained crushed pineapple, 1 teas. lemon juice and 1/2 teas. salt and combine with 1/2 cup of mayonnaise. Sprinkle with paprika on top of each serving. Stuffed olives for garnish.

**Garden Salad**  
Cut a slice crosswise from a head of lettuce, place it on a salad plate and on the lettuce place a slice of tomato, on this lay four or five stalks of asparagus. Serve with mayonnaise drawn over the top of all.

The university has two commencement exercises. On Friday morning, June 4, the ceremony for those graduating from the university's colleges located in Chicago—Medicine, Dentistry and Pharmacy—will be held in the Chicago Civic Opera House. The speaker for that occasion will be Dr. Arthur Cutts Willard, president of the university.

The annual commencement for the Urbana-Champaign college will be held Monday morning, June 8. The speaker will be Professor James W. Garner, head of the University's Department of Political Science, and an outstanding world authority on international law. He has been a member of the faculty since 1904.

Proceeding the commencement for the Urbana departments, of course, will be the baccalaureate services on Sunday afternoon, June 7. The speaker then will be Dr. Henry Sloane Coffin, president of the Union Theological Seminary, New York City.

The entire commencement program next Monday will be broadcast by the University's radio station WILL, which operates on a frequency of 890 kilocycles.
