Mrs. Minnie Zoehler Bleimehl, wife of E. D. Bleimehl of Deerfield, passed away very suddenly Friday evening from a heart attack. Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at St. Paul's church, Deerfield, with interment at the North Shore Garden of Memories. Rev. F. G. Piepenbrok officiated.

 Ice Box Cake

Line a bread pan with lady fingers. Boil 1/2 cup minute tapioca and 1 pint of grape juice until clear. Add 1 cup sugar. When cool add 1/2 cup orange juice, 10 marshmellow cherries cut up and 2 tbsps. cherry juice. Pour over lady fingers and let set in ice box. Serve with whipped cream.

1 1/2 cups sugar
 1 1/2 cups flour
 1/2 cup orange juice
 1/2 teas. baking powder
 4 eggs, separated

Beat egg yolks until lemon colored, add sugar, alternate orange juice and flour and baking powder. Beat the whites until stiff and fold into yellow mixture. Bake in angel food pan, starting in a cold oven. Bake 45 to 50 minutes at 350 degrees F.

Frosting
 3 tbsps. butter creamed, grate the rind of one whole orange into the butter and cream well, juice of one orange, 1 tbsps. water and add to juice, then add 3 cups confectioners sugar, blend well and spread on cake.

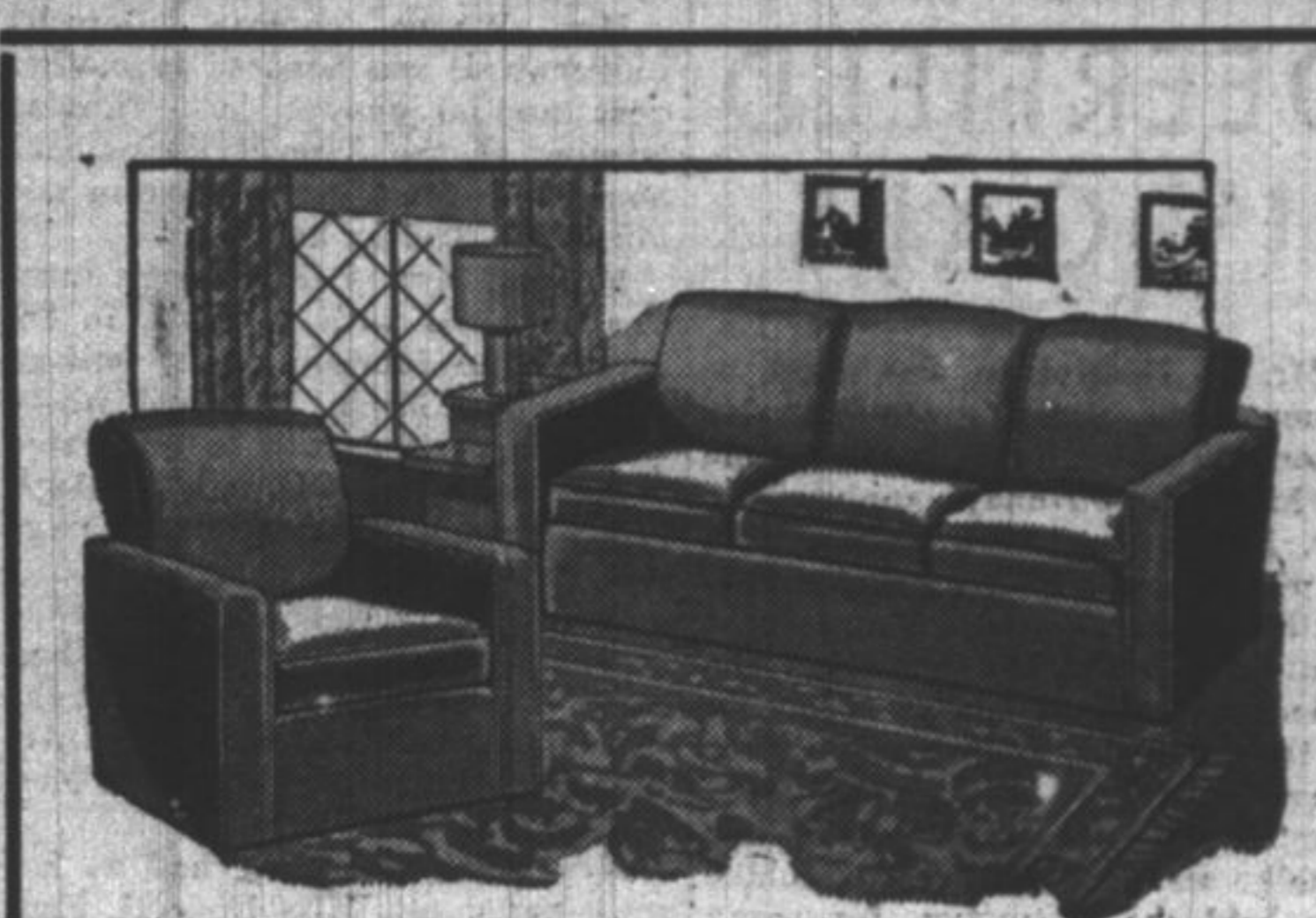
