**Former Resident of Deerfield Dies in Minnesota, June 3**

L. B. Miller, 77, former resident of Deerfield, and husband of the former Sarah Elizabeth Fritsch of that town, died Wednesday afternoon, June 3, at Bethesda hospital in St. Paul.

Fritsch in Deerfield will recall that Mr. and Mrs. Miller returned to Deerfield last September to celebrate their golden wedding anniversary.

Probably the oldest postmaster in point of service in Minnesota, Mr. Miller had served the Randolph post office since the beginning of the town, with the exception of four years. He was first appointed postmaster by President Grover Cleveland in 1868. He served for eight years, then, after a four year lapse, he was reappointed in 1896 and has served continuously since, having received commissions from ten presidents, Cleveland, Harrison, McKinley, Roosevelt, Taft, Harding, Coolidge, Hoover and Roosevelt.

**Tuberculosis Ass'n Asks for Tax Levy**

The Lake County Tuberculosis association presented to the board of supervisors on Monday, a petition for the levy of an annual tax for the care of tuberculosis patients in Lake county.

The petition requests the supervisors to instruct the county clerk to place on the ballot at the November election the proposition for the levy of a tax not to exceed one and a half mills on the dollar for the establishment and maintenance of a tuberculosis sanitarium.

If the majority of the citizens voting on this ballot favor the levy, the care of the tuberculosis will be shifted from the supervisors to the fund for this purpose. Anyone in the county suffering from tuberculosis is entitled to free care according to the provisions of this act.

Signatures for the petition were received from every town in the county by members of the board of directors of the Tuberculosis association.

The regular semi-monthly chest clinic of the Lake County Tuberculosis association will be held at the St. Therese hospital on Wednesday, June 17, from 9 to 3.
