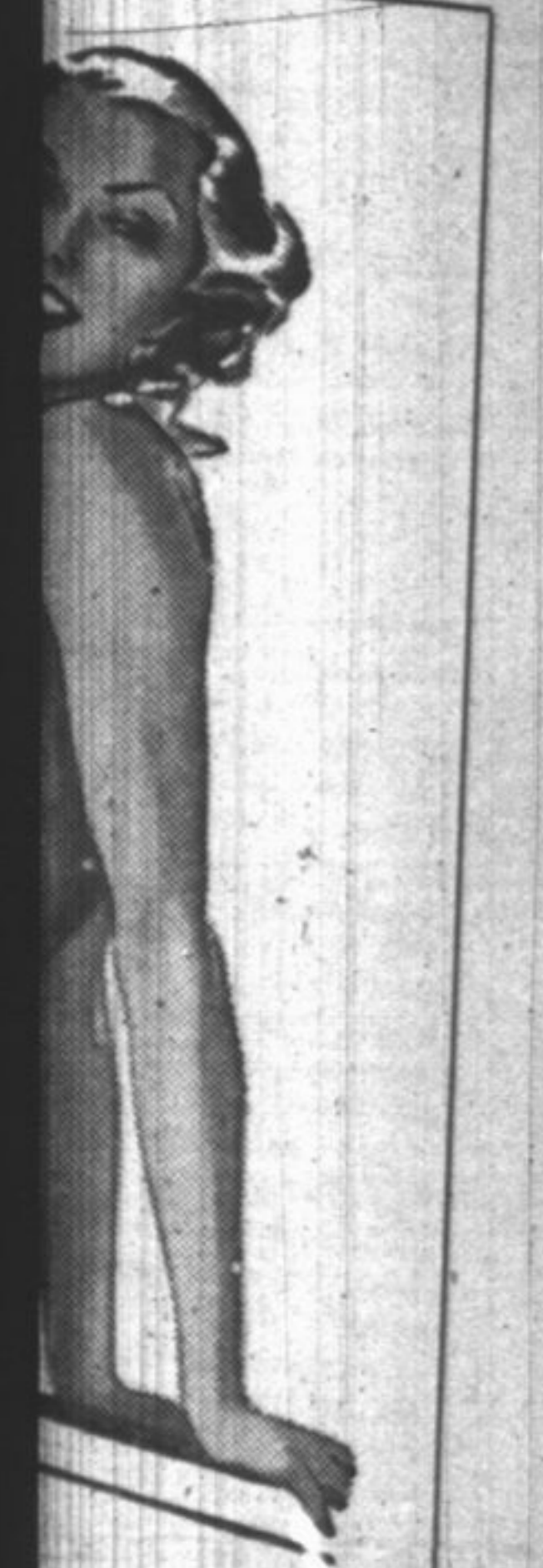


Art League To Meet Saturday at Wilmette Harbor
