The Forest Tent Caterpillar
An insect that damages our native trees, particularly those on large estates, is always to be looked for by the tree owners. Naturally we wish to take every precaution to prohibit as much damage as possible.

On the North Shore one can find these tent caterpillars in action at the present time. Fortunately for us they are not doing the tremendous amount of damage that is being done in Canada and other sections of the northeast.

The first sign of the tent caterpillar is eaten leaves by a caterpillar with a blue head and silvery diamond shaped spots along the back. They affect hard maple trees more often than other types. However, they will attack other trees at times when the insects are in a plague stage.

When not feeding, these caterpillars cluster on the trunks and large

Day and night, the visitors will find a colorful turmoil of activity. By day the grounds and buildings, the latter with a color scheme supervised by Otto Tegen, of New York, one of the country's leading experts on color, will present an arresting picture of structural design, landscaped beauty and balanced multi-colored decoration. By night, the entire area will blaze with a lighting scheme which, authorities declare, far surpasses anything of the kind ever before seen.

In the great Hall of Progress will be found a tremendous exhibit by the United States Government in which will be displayed work of the various departments of the government—agriculture, commerce, post office, interior and all the rest. This great display will occupy one whole side of the building. Among industrial exhibits in the building are: Westinghouse Electric & Mfg. Co., General Electric Co., The Hoover

Co., White Sewing Machine Co., Otis Elevator Co., and many others.

In the Automotive building will be the displays of the Ford Motor Co., General Motors Corp., Chrysler Corp., White Motor Co., and other motor and accessory manufacturers. These two buildings are over 500 feet long and about 200 feet wide.

Other industrial exhibits will be found in the Lakeside exhibition hall and in various special buildings.

Lake Forest Horse Show Takes Place This Week

Chicago becomes the show horse capital of the country this week as the outstanding stables in the United States, with horses valued at \$1,000,000 compete at Onwentsia in the 36th annual Lake Forest horse show. Proceeds from the four day competition which begins today (Thursday) and continues through Sunday with \$6,000 in cash prizes in addition to trophies and ribbons, will be donated to the Lake Forest Hospital association.

Two hundred and ninety-six horses, comprising 960 entries in 75 classes, will exhibit at Onwentsia, setting a season's record for contestants and entries in American horse shows.

Nearly half of the horses entered are Chicago owned. H. Leslie Atlass, vice president of the Columbia Broadcasting System, has entered two three gaited ribbon winners. Mrs. A. C. Thompson will show a string of hackneys and jumpers. Other Chicagoand exhibitors include Mrs. Howard Hurwith of Wilmette; Mrs. E. H. Oppenheim of Highland Park, who has entered Bold Venture; Mrs. J. T. Bower of Lake Forest; Mrs. Seymour Wheeler of Lake Forest; Miss Jane Marhman of Hinsdale; Mrs. Edward K. Welles of Lake Forest, and Donald MacPherson of Winnetka.

Wisconsin will be represented by the Floyd Rudocher string from Wauwatosa and several entries from Milwaukee. Miss Eileen Bigelow, of White Bear Lake, Minn., has entered two jumpers, Turrey and Viaduct.

All box seats have been sold, but arrangements have been made to handle 5,000 spectators in the reserved seat sections, which will be priced at 50 cents. In addition to the horse show, the week-end activities at Onwentsia include a pet show for children on Friday morning and bazaar which will be run by club women of Lake Forest.
