Spending Record Set by Congress

Washington—(IPS)—The 74th Seventy-fourth Congress, just adjourned, set an all time high record for free spending, a check-up has revealed. Total appropriations for the first and second sessions were \$19,296,187,373, a new record for appropriations by either a peace time or a war time congress.

These totals, which are those of Senator Glass, chairman of the Senate Appropriations committee, do not include contract authorizations for the army, navy and other departments nor re-appropriated monies left over from appropriations made by other congresses.

Each session of the Seventy-fourth spent almost exactly the same amount. The first session, from January 3 to August 26, 1935, appropriated \$9,579,755,510 and the second session which began last January 3 and adjourned on June 21 appropriated \$9,716,430,863.

Included in the grants of the "twenty-billion-dollar Congress" were \$1,730,000,000 for payment of the soldiers' bonus, \$1,425,000,000 to start the soil conservation service on its way, 296,000,000 to liquidate contracts invalidated when the Supreme Court ruled the AAA unconstitutional; \$208,000,000 for the Civilian Conservation Corps and \$459,000,000 to finance the new social security program, made during the second session.

While \$800,000,000 in new taxes were levied, the actual reaching down into the general electorate for taxes to meet government costs was postponed until after the November elections.

McHenry To Celebrate Hundredth Anniversary

On Friday, Saturday and Sunday, July 31 and August 1 and 2, McHenry, Illinois, will celebrate its 100th anniversary. For it was in 1836 that the first settlers came to Illinois and settled in that spot which has since become known not only as a thriving town, but also as a center of the Illinois lake resorts.

The outstanding event of the celebration will be a pageant which will be presented each of the three days. It is being produced under the direction of Marie Agnes Foley, who is well known throughout Chicago and the middle west for her theatrical productions.

Miss Foley is the founder and director of the Jack and Jill Players. During the past 8 years she has been in close contact with all the theatrical and radio events, and has written or directed many pageants and historical dramas. She produced

the historical play "When Chicago Was Young" which was written by Alice Gerstenberg and Herma Clark—based on Miss Clark's well known column of the same name which appears every Sunday in the Chicago Tribune. She also wrote and directed the huge pageants which the Chicago Federation of Labor gave at Soldiers Field two and three years ago.

Miss Foley will be assisted in the writing of the pageant by Irving Vendig, who is well known as a writer for both stage and radio. Bill Myers will aid Miss Foley in the scenery design and construction and Pearl Roos, who has been connected with Miss Foley's organization for several years, will work on the costumes and aid in the general production.

The pageant itself will depict various outstanding episodes in the growth of McHenry. It is being planned so that it can be produced outdoors, if the weather is suitable, or indoors if it rains. Much atten-

tion is being paid to the pictorial effect of the scenes, especially the costumes and scenery.

United Buys More 12 Ton Transports

Purchase of five additional 21-passenger type twin-engined Douglas transports at a cost of \$103,000 each, which will give the company a fleet of fifteen of these 12-ton transports for its New-York-Chicago-California route, was announced today by W. A. Patterson, president of United Air Lines.

Delivery of the first plane is scheduled for August 15, with two a week thereafter. These larger transports with their longer cruising range will enable United to again reduce its coast-to-coast flying time, company officials said. With the addition of these fifteen transports, United will have a fleet of 65 twin-engined type planes. The 50 ten-passenger

transports which have comparable speed with the larger Douglasses will be flown on schedules calling for more frequent stops than will be made by the new planes which have a cruising range of 2,000 miles.

F. L. Gehr Dies Sunday from Heart Attack

Francis L. Gehr, 59, of 330 Bloom st., dropped dead of a heart attack Sunday evening after an outing in his motorboat, as he was lifting the boat from the water at the Park ave. beach.

Funeral services were held yesterday morning, interment being in Graceland cemetery. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Ruth Gehr, and two daughters, Mary and Louise, the latter of whom was with him at the time of his death. Mr. Gehr was associated with the Falne-Webber brokerage firm of Chicago.
