Every community, even those with only 100 population, within the 6,000 square mile area in which the Public Service Company of Northern Illinois operates is receiving electric service, according to an analysis of a directory of electric service in Illinois recently issued from Springfield by the Illinois Commerce Commission. The report, prepared by the Rates and Research Section of the Commission in collaboration with the engineering section, covers all incorporated villages and towns and unincorporated communities in the state and the list of communities which have no electric service, including those as small as 100 population, contains no towns in the area served by the Public Service Company of Northern Illinois.

This record of complete saturation of the available communities within its area is the result, according to officials of the company, of the Public Service Company's long-


