**NOTICE OF ELECTION TO BE HELD JULY 23, A. D. 1936, AT THE VILLAGE HALL IN THE VILLAGE OF DEERFIELD CONCERNING THE "DEERFIELD FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT."**

Notice is hereby given to the legal voters of the following described territory comprising the proposed fire district known as the "Deerfield Fire Protection District," to-wit:

Beginning at the northeast corner of the west 1/4 of the southeast 1/4 of Section 17, Township 43 North, Range 12 East of the 3rd Principal Meridian; thence west on the 3rd Principal Meridian to the north line of the south 1/2 of Sections 17 and 18, township and range aforesaid, to the northwest corner of the southwest 1/4 of said Section 18; thence south on the range line 37.3 feet to the northeast corner of the southeast 1/4 of Section 15, Township 43 North, Range 11 East of the 3rd Principal Meridian; thence west on the north line of the south 1/2 of Sections 15, 14 and 13, township and range aforesaid, to its intersection with the center line of the Des Plaines River; thence south along the center line of said Des Plaines River to its intersection with the south line of the southeast 1/4 of Section 25, Township 42 North, Range 11 East of the 3rd Principal Meridian; thence east on the south line of the southeast 1/4 of Section 25, Township 42 North, Range 11 East of the 3rd Principal Meridian; thence south on the west line of the northwest 1/4 of said Section 6 to the southwest corner of said northwest quarter section; thence east on the south line of the north 1/2 of Sections 6 and 5, Township 42 North, Range 12 East of the 3rd Principal Meridian to the southeast corner of the northeast 1/4 of said Section 5 to the northwest corner of the northwest 1/4 of Section 4, township and range last

aforesaid; thence east on the north line of the northwest 1/4 of said Section 4 to the southwesterly right-of-way line of the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific Railroad; thence southeasterly on said southwesterly right-of-way line to the south line of Lot 2 of the northwest 1/4 of said Section 4 and on the south line of Lot 2 of the Northwest 1/4 of Section 3, township and range last aforesaid, to the southeast corner of the last aforesaid Lot 2; thence north on the east line of said Lot 2 to the northeast corner thereof; thence west on the north line of the last aforesaid Lot 2 to the southeast corner of the Village of Deerfield, said southeast corner being 2010 feet east of the southwest corner of Section 34, Township 43 North, Range 12 East of the 3rd Principal Meridian; thence northwesterly on the easterly corporate limits of the Village of Deerfield to the northeast corner of said Village; thence west on the north line of the northwest 1/4 of Section 25, township and range last aforesaid, to the southeast corner of the Village of Hancock, being the southeast corner of Section 20, Township 43 North, Range 12 East of the 3rd Principal Meridian; thence north on the east line of said Section 20 to the northeast corner of the south 1/2 of the northeast 1/4 of said Section 20; thence west on the north line of said southwest 1/4 of the northeast 1/4 of the northeast 1/4 of said Section 20; thence north on the east line of the west 1/2 of the southeast 1/4 of the northeast 1/4 of said Section 20 to the northeast corner thereof; thence north on the east line of the west 1/2 of the southeast 1/4 of Section 17, township and range last aforesaid, to the place of beginning—the lands hereby bounded being contiguous and wholly situated in Lake County and in Cook County in the State of Illinois.

That an election will be held between the hours of six o'clock in the forenoon and five o'clock in the afternoon, Central Stand-

ard Time, or seven o'clock in the forenoon and six o'clock in the afternoon, Central Daylight Saving Time, on the 25th day of July, A. D. 1936, at the Village Hall in the Village of Deerfield.

The purpose of said election shall be to determine whether a fire district comprising of the above described territory shall be incorporated, said fire district to be known as the "Deerfield Fire Protection District" as proposed in the order entered by the County Judge of Lake County on June 15th, A. D. 1936, pursuant to a meeting had at that time on a petition theretofore filed praying for the incorporation of the aforesaid fire district, at which time and place all legal voters of said proposed fire protection district may cast a ballot for said fire protection district or against said fire protection district.
