**Winnetka Music Club  
Chooses Artists for  
Series Opening Oct. 24**

Thirteen years ago, a group of enterprising North Shore men and women imbued with an interest in great music, decided to bring that music, which they so thoroughly enjoyed and appreciated, to our own doorsteps. So they formed the Winnetka Music Club Artist Recital Series, arranged a course, secured guarantors. Within ten days, these energetic men and women had completely sold out the course. Before the end of the season, guarantors were dispensed with. The series has ever since stood "on its own."

The original purpose of bringing great music to the North Shore has been consistently adhered to. Reviewing the thirteen years in a kaleidoscopic panorama of great names in music. New Trier audiences have thrilled to the glorious voices of Sophie Braslau, Claire Dux, Louise Homer, Edith Mason, Kirsten Flagstad, Elizabeth Rothberg, Dusolina Giannini. The great tenors, baritones and basses, John Charles Thomas, Lawrence Tibbett, Tito Schipa, Giovanni Martinelli, Mario Chamlee, Frederick Jagel have all sung before Winnetka footlights.

More than four thousand cheered the playing of Vladimir Horowitz, great Russian pianist; The Spaniard, Jose Iturbi; the American violinist, Albert Spalding; the German cellist, Emanuel Feuermann; the Russian pianist, Sergei Rachmaninoff, have taken their bows before packed Winnetka houses. This year the club scores a scoop with the Chicago debut of the duo-pianists, blonde, svelte, Vera Brodsky and her partner, husky, athletic Harold Triggs. The pair who recently scored as guest artists with Werner Janssen and the New York Philharmonic Orchestra, have for several seasons been features of the General Motors, Camel Caravan, Rudy Vallee Variety hour and the Steinway Piano series. The series opens on Saturday evening, October 24, with Lauritz Melchior, Danish tenor of Metropolitan's Wagnerian wing; and includes return engagements for Marian Anderson, Negro contralto; the American violinist, Albert Spalding, and concludes on March 1 with the re-appearance of Myra Hess, distinguished English pianist.
