Household Worker's Training Program Offered by State

To meet an acute and increasing demand for trained household workers, the Illinois State Employment Service last March sponsored the formation of the Household Workers' Training Program—a project designed to give an intensive training of from six weeks to two months to young women who were willing to take jobs as general maids in private homes. The program was financed by FERA funds, and was put under the supervision of Miss Hazel Schultz, who has had many years of experience in directing training of this kind.

Four training centers were established in Chicago, at 350 Belden avenue, the University of Chicago Settlement, Lincoln Center, and in a residence near Longwood drive in Beverly Hills. The training was made available chiefly to young women from families on relief. Each of these centers now has approximately forty five girls in training.

The girls are given thorough training in the preparation and serving of food, care of the house, assistance in the care of children, and in general household work, including laundry and ironing. Although the general length of the course is from six weeks to two months, the young women are certified for jobs as soon as they have demonstrated that they are good cooks, that they can take care of the work of an ordinary home thoroughly and efficiently, and that they know how to organize their time to the best advantage.
