

### Farmers' Votes Defeat Deerfield Fire District

Farmers outside the village of Deerfield and Bannockburn showed very decidedly at the election Saturday that they did not want fire protection.

The outlying voters cast their ballots at Clavey's Nursery 91 against fire protection and only 3 votes in favor of it.

The issue was to increase the size of the district which is served by the Deerfield Fire Department, to obtain better fire fighting equipment, such as newly invented chemicals for places where water cannot be obtained and to have a better fire truck and maintain a day and night man.

It was a very quiet election with only 250 votes cast in the entire township. Polling places were the Masonic Temple, the Bannockburn School and Clavey's office.

### New Stamp Issue To Be Out August 26

A new stamp of three cent denomination commemorating Susan B. Anthony and the 16th anniversary of the ratification of the 19th rights will be issued Aug. 26 in Washington D. C., according to Postmaster Joseph P. Daly.

The stamps will be on sale in all postoffices on Aug. 27 or as soon afterward as possible. Stamp collectors who want stamps from the first issue may send orders not to exceed ten stamps with the money payable to the postmaster of Washington, D. C.
